Bracher Park is a 3.5 acre neighborhood park located near the intersection of Bowers Avenue and Chromite Drive originally constructed in 1969. Residents of all ages walk, play and picnic here. Over time, the Bracher Park amenities have served the neighborhood families well, and in doing so, have now surpassed their useful life.

On September 24, 2013 the Santa Clara City Council adopted a two year goal to “Enhance Community Sports and Recreational Assets.” The Bracher Park Rehabilitation Project was identified as the first park to be improved. The Parks & Recreation Department is leading the effort to renovate the playground, picnic area, add an outdoor fitness area, and replace the basketball court.

Community outreach and involvement has included: a Fund Your Park cooperative effort with the National Recreation & Parks Association that raised \$1375, an “I Love Bracher Park” neighborhood picnic on September 27, 2014, and resident input on the size and types of improvements needed for Bracher Park. The City has allocated \$125,000 to fund the Bracher Park Rehabilitation Project. This is the 2<sup>nd</sup> of the 3 outreach meetings, and will allow the community to provide input for the playground renovation.
