SUBJECT: Correspondence Received Regarding the Proposed Football Stadium as of May 29, 2009

For the period of November 1, 2008 through May 29, 2009, the Mayor and Council Offices, City Manager's Office and other City departments and municipal addresses have received 201 additional emails, phone messages, and letters from residents or others regarding the proposal for a 49ers football stadium. The correspondence has been placed in Council Offices for review. The letters were in support, expressing concerns or opposition, provided suggestions or did not articulate a position. Some of the individuals forwarded copies of newspaper articles or reports. In some cases, multiple items of correspondence have been received from a single individual; for this reason, staff will continue to tabulate the total amount of correspondence received, but will not count the numbers of items in support, expressing concerns or opposition.

For public clarification, correspondence is provided to the Mayor and Council, and City Manager, shortly after receipt. Correspondence is being acknowledged by staff as time permits. Correspondence is placed into the public record through these periodic Agenda Reports.

As Superintendent of the Santa Clara Unified School District, I'm writing to urge you to move forward with plans for a new Forty-Niner stadium. Without your vote, our schools will be on track to lose out on \$141 million in much-needed funding.

Due to state legislation, the City's investment of redevelopment funds in the stadium will trigger a major financial benefit to our schools. Attached, please find a memo created by the School District's economic advisors, Public Economics, Inc., with more details. Since the funds will be added to our general operating budget, we can use them for projects that matter most to parents and students in our community such as:

- Maintaining small class sizes; Attracting and retaining the best possible teachers; Narrowing the performance gap for students in the classroom; and Maintaining a safe environment on our school campuses.

My staff and I are constantly faced with the challenges of stretching our resources to provide our students with the quality education they will need to become tomorrow's leaders. Our student population is rapidly growing, but school districts throughout our state face tremendous challenges due to California's current budget crisis.



Subj: Projected Future Payments to Santa Clara Unified School District from
Santa Clara Bayshore North Redevelopment Project

Introduction

On behalf of Public Economics, Inc. ("PEI"), I am pleased to transmit the attached projections of future payments to Santa Clara Unified School District ("District") by the Santa Clara Redevelopment Agency ("RDA") from the RDA's Bayshore North Redevelopment Project ("Project"), assuming construction in the Project of a proposed new football stadium for the San Francisco 49ers. These payments to the District (plus other affected taxing entities) will be required pursuant to AB 1290, including Health and Safety Code ("HSC") 33607.7 and 33607.5 (AB 1290 Payments) and HSC 33676(b) (Basic Aid Payments), following adoption of a future amendment to the Project's redevelopment plan pursuant to SB 211.

Summary

As set forth in the RDA's redevelopment plan for the Project, the RDA cannot incur new indebtedness required to finance the RDA's portion of the new stadium without amending (pursuant to SB 211) the redevelopment plan to eliminate the current "date to incur debt" time limitation of 01/01/04. The required SB 211 amendment is a "minor amendment" that can be accomplished by adoption of a City ordinance, without the time consuming process usually required for "major amendments" to the redevelopment plan.

Assuming adoption by the RDA of the SB 211 amendment prior to 06/30/11, PEI projects the District to receive AB 1290 Payments and Basic Aid Payments for FYs 2011-12 through FY 2025-26, including:

- \$ 46.37 million in AB 1290 Payments
- \$ 94.30 million in (net) Basic Aid Payments
- \$140.67 million combined total payments

PEI has assumed the District will choose to use most (if not all) AB 1290 Payments and Basic Aid Payments for District operations, i.e., for provision of educational services within the District, including within the Project. However, as a "basic aid" district, the District is entitled to use 100 percent of such payments for operations and/or facilities. Basic Aid Payments may be used without restriction. AB 1290 Payments may be used without restriction if used for operations, and with minimal restrictions (e.g., a finding by the District's Board of Education) if used for facilities.

AB 1290 Payments and Basic Aid Payments are projected to be small initially, starting at a combined total of less than \$750,000 for FY 2011-12, but increasing to more than \$10 million for FY 2017-18 and more than \$15 million for FY 2025-26. These are payments the District would not otherwise receive in the absence of the SB 211 amendment.

Projected future payments to the District are derived in part from prior year tax increment based on actual assessed values ("AVs") in the Project for FYs 2003-04 through 2008-09 obtained from the County Controller-Treasurer ("C-T"). Projected future payments are also derived from future tax increment based on projected AVs in the Project for future years, including a \$400 million football stadium in FY 2015-16, provided by the 49ers and the City.

Actual future payments to the District will be:

- *Less than projected* if future AVs in the Project are less than projected (or occur later)
- *Greater than projected* if future AVs for the project are greater than projected (or occur sooner)

Future payments will also be greater than projected if the RDA reaches its current tax increment dollar limitation of \$1.219 billion, and:

- Amends the redevelopment plan to increase the tax increment cap (which will require a major amendment), in which case AB 1290 Payments and Basic Aid Payments will be higher than projected
- Does not amend the redevelopment plan to increase the tax increment cap, in which case AB 1290 Payments and Basic Aid Payments may be less or greater than projected, *but will be supplemented by the District's share of what would otherwise be tax increment* the RDA would not be eligible to receive once the cap has been reached, which will then revert to the District instead

Actual future payments to the District will also depend on continuation and interpretation of current California Redevelopment Law governing the calculation of AB 1290 Payments and Basic Aid Payments, which has been the subject of some controversy Statewide. PEI generally concurs with what *appears* to be the interpretation of AB 1290 Payment and Basic Aid Payment statutes by the RDA. However, PEI reserves the right to dispute the RDA's interpretation should we determine that the RDA's ultimate interpretation is different from its apparent current position.

Background

The redevelopment plan for the Project was originally adopted on 12/28/73, with a base year of FY 1973-74. Affected taxing entities, including the District, continue to receive the level of property tax revenues generated within the Project in the base year. Base year revenue equals about \$88,000, or 1 percent of base year AV of about \$8.8 M. With an estimated property tax share in the Project of 38.41 percent, the District receives about \$34,000 per year from the Project.

However, by FY 2008-09 AV had grown to \$2.819 billion, for an average increase of 17.9 percent per year. The resulting increase in property tax revenues constitutes tax increment, effectively all of which has been allocated (not to the affected taxing entities but) to the RDA to fund "redevelopment activity." PEI estimates that tax increment to the RDA in FY 2008-09 from the secured and unsecured assessment rolls alone will exceed \$28 million.

In the absence of the RDA, any increase in property tax revenues would have been allocated instead to affected taxing entities, including the District. For FY 2008-09, PEI estimates what would otherwise be the District's share of tax increment received by the RDA at about \$10.8 million.

Many RDAs are required, by contract or by statute, to make so-called "pass-through payments" to affected taxing entities from tax increment they receive (or would otherwise receive) to alleviate the financial burden or detriment of redevelopment activity. However, in annual reports to the State Controller's Office ("SCO") the Santa Clara RDA shows no contractual or statutory pass-through obligations to affected taxing entities, including the District.

Absent a future amendment to the Project's redevelopment plan that triggers statutory pass-through payments (e.g., pursuant to SB 211), the District (and other entities) will continue to receive no pass-through payments until the RDA's tax increment authority for the Project ends on Dec. 28, 2026, which is the maximum time limit allowed under California Redevelopment Law. This is the case even though the number of students generated from the Project, directly or indirectly, has presumably increased since FY 1973-74, and will continue to increase through Dec. 28, 2026. Only at that time—17 ½ years from now—will the District begin to receive its 100 percent share of TI, which will presumably have increased from its current estimated level of \$10.8 million based on future AV growth in the Project.¹

Per RDA staff, the RDA does not want to adopt the SB 211 amendment until just before it has to finance the RDA's portion of the new stadium project. Consistent with the proposed term sheet from the 49ers, PEI understands that this will have to occur in early 2011. Hence, PEI has assumed the SB 211 ordinance will be adopted prior to 07/01/11, which will trigger AB 1290 payments to the District beginning in FY 2011-12.

¹ Assuming the RDA had sufficient existing indebtedness on 01/01/04 (when it reached its date-to-incur-debt time limit) to justify being allocated all future tax increment generated within the Project. If the RDA does not have sufficient existing indebtedness, some tax increment that would otherwise be received by the RDA may revert to the District (and other affected taxing entities) prior to expiration of the RDA's tax increment authority in 2026.

Analysis

Unlike most K-12 districts in the State, the District is a “basic aid district.” This means that:

- Property tax revenues received by the District exceed what would otherwise be the District’s revenue limit for operations
- State funding of District operations under Prop 98 is zero, except for \$120 per average daily attendance (ADA) to which all K-12 districts are entitled regardless of property tax collections
- District’s share of tax increment diverted to the RDA within the Project is not backfilled by the State,² making every dollar of tax increment diverted to the RDA a dollar of operating revenue foregone by the District

The District has been a basic aid district since at least FY 1997-98 (notwithstanding the diversion of the District’s share of tax increment within the Project and other redevelopment project areas), and is expected to continue its basic aid status in the future. Assuming the District is still a basic aid district *at the time the SB 211 amendment is adopted* (a requirement to receive Basic Aid Payments), the District will be entitled to receive both AB 1290 Payments and Basic Aid Payments from the Project based on complex statutory formulas:

- **AB 1290 Payments:** Per HSC 33607.7 and HSC 33607.5, the District will be entitled to receive its pro rata share of total AB 1290 payments paid by the RDA in two tiers:
 - **Tier 1:** Per HSC 33607.5(b), total Tier 1 payments equal 25 percent of 80 percent of “the [portion of] tax increments received by the [RDA]” attributable to growth in AV above an “adjusted based year,” which per HSC 33607.7(c) is the year in which the date-to-incur-debt time *limitation* of 01/01/04 “would have taken affect without the [SB 211] amendment,” i.e., FY 2003-04. Per HSC 33607.7(b), Tier 1 payments commence in “the first fiscal year following the fiscal year in which the adjusted base year value is determined” by the SB 211 amendment, i.e., in FY 2011-12.

Per HSC 33607.5(a)(2), the RDA is required to allocate total AB 1290 payments “among the affected taxing entities in proportion to the percentage share of property taxes each affected taxing entity, including the [City], receives during the fiscal year the funds are allocated.” The percentage share of property taxes the District receives in the Project is currently 38.41 percent.

- **Tier 2:** Per HSC 33607.5(c), total Tier 2 payments equal 21 percent of 80 percent of “the portion of tax increments received by the [RDA]” attributable to growth in AV above a “first adjusted based year,” which is the “10th fiscal year in which the [RDA] receives tax increments,” i.e., the 10th year following the year the date-to-incur-debt time *limitation* would have taken affect without the [SB 211] amendment” in FY 2013-14. Tier 2 payments commence in the 11th fiscal year following the fiscal year in which the

² As would be the case for a “revenue limit district,” i.e., a district for which property tax revenues received are less than its revenue limit, with State apportionments to the District making up the difference.

date-to-incur-debt time limitation would have taken affect without the SB 211 amendment, i.e., FY 2014-15.³

Per HSC 33607.5(a)(2), the RDA is required to allocate total AB 1290 payments “among the affected taxing entities in proportion to the percentage share of property taxes each affected taxing entity, including the [City], receives during the fiscal year the funds are allocated.” However, per HSC 33607.5(c), the City is not entitled to receive Tier 2 payments. Hence, the District’s proportionate share of Tier 2 payments equals the District’s 38.41 percentage share of Tier 1 payments plus the District’s proportionate share of the City’s 11.92 (pre-ERAF) percentage share, resulting in a total District share of 43.61 percent of Tier 2 payments.

Per HSC 3360735(a)(4)(A), if the District were a revenue limit district, 43.3 percent of AB 1290 Payments allocated to the District from Tier 1 and Tier 2 would be received for benefit of the State, i.e., as an offset, per Education Code (“EC”) 42238(h)(6), against State funding of the District’s revenue limit under Proposition 98. The remaining 56.7 percent of AB 1290 Payments would be available for funding of educational facilities without revenue limit offset. *However, as a basic aid district, the District may use 100 percent of AB 1290 payments for operations or facilities, as it sees fit.*

- **Basic Aid Payments:** Per HSC 33676(b)(3), in the absence of a pre-1994 contractual entitlement, the District will be entitled to receive additional payments from the Project “derived from 80 percent of the growth in [AV] that occurs within the portion of the District within the [Project] from the year in which the *amendment* takes effect pursuant to [HSC 33607.7(c)],” i.e., the year in which the SB 211 amendment is assumed to be adopted in FY 2010-11. Basic Aid Payments also commence in the first fiscal year following the fiscal year in which the adjusted base year value is determined by the SB 211 amendment, i.e., in FY 2011-12.

However, per HSC 33676(b)(4), the RDA “shall subtract from [Basic Aid Payments] the amount that a basic aid district receives pursuant to [HSC] 33607.5 and 33607.7 for the purposes of [EC 42238(h)(6)],” i.e., 43.3 percent of AB 1290 Payments. This may be implemented in at least two ways, including:

- Method 1, in which the County C-T makes AB 1290 Payments to the District (on behalf of the RDA) plus *net* Basic Aid Payments (i.e., *gross* Basic Aid Payments less 43.3 percent of AB 1290 Payments)
- Method 2, in which the County C-T makes *gross* Basic Aid Payments to the District and the RDA makes only 56.7 percent of AB 1290 Payments

Total payments received by the District will be the same with both methods.⁴

³ Community Redevelopment Law also provides for a third tier of AB 1290 Payments, equal to 14 percent of 80 percent of “the portion of tax increments received by the [RDA]” attributable to growth in AV above a “second adjusted based year,” which is the “30th fiscal year in which the [RDA] receives tax increments,” i.e., the 30th year following the year the date-to-incur-debt time “*limitation* would have taken affect without the [SB 211] amendment” in FY 2033-34. However, there will be no Tier 3 payments from the Project, since the RDA’s authority to receive tax increment will have previously expired in FY 2026-27.

Findings

Page 1 of Exhibit A shows:

- Past and projected future AV growth and corresponding tax increment in the Project
- Portions of projected tax increment subject to AB 1290 Payments in Tier 1 and Tier 2
- Corresponding total AB 1290 Payments in Tier 1 and Tier 2
- District's proportionate share of total AB 1290 Payments in Tier 1 and Tier 2

As shown in Column A of page 1, AB 1290 Payments to the District from Tiers 1 and 2 combined are projected to total \$46.365 million between FYs 2011-12 and 2025-26. As shown in Columns B and C of page 1, AB 1290 Payments include \$22.02 million (43.3 percent share) plus \$24.34 million (56.7 percent share). AB 1290 Payments are heavily back-loaded, with smaller payments in earlier years and much higher payments in later years.

Page 2 of Exhibit A shows:

- Past and projected future AV growth and corresponding tax increment in the Project
- Projected annual and cumulative AV growth within the District's portion of the Project "from the year in which the *amendment* takes effect pursuant to [HSC 33607.7(c)]," i.e., FY 2010-11, plus 80 percent of cumulative AV growth on which Basic Aid Payments are based
- Corresponding *gross* Basic Aid Payments (Column D), the 43.3. percent portion of AB 1290 Payments (Column E), and *net* Basic Aid Payments (Column F)
- Total combined AB 1290 Payments and Basic Aid Payments to the District using Method 1 (Columns G and H) and Method 2 (Columns I and J)

As shown in Column D, *gross* Basic Aid Payments are projected to total \$116.33 million between FYs 2011-12 and 2025-26. As shown in Column F, *net* Basic Aid Payments are projected to total \$94.30 million between FYs 2011-12 and 2025-26. This net amount is the total Basic Aid Payments reported in the Summary section above. Basic Aid Payments are also heavily back-loaded, with smaller payments in earlier years and much higher payments in later years.

As shown in Columns H and J, *combined* AB 1290 Payments and Basic Aid Payments are projected to total \$140.67 million between FYs 2011-12 and 2025-26. As noted in the Summary section above, *actual* combined payments may be less than or greater than projected.

Page 3 of Exhibit A contains detailed notes and sources.

⁴ Basic Aid Payments per HSC 33676 are made by the County C-T, not by the RDA, and per 76 *Ops. Cal. Atty. Gen. 137 (1993)*, are presumably NOT deemed to be part of tax increment received by the RDA—hence, not subject to the RDA's tax increment cap. In contrast, AB 1290 Payments per HSC 33607.5 and 336.7.7 are made directly by the RDA, or by the County C-T on behalf of the RDA.



Dear Mayor Mahan:

I am concerned about the Santa Clara 49ers stadium project that you are considering, and its effects on the finances of the City of Santa Clara. At 100,000 people, Santa Clara is too small of a city to afford a \$160 million contribution to build a stadium. Only Santa Clara residents will be contributing public funds for the stadium, even though people from other cities will be attending 49ers games at the stadium. Santa Clara's redevelopment funds will be used, as well as funds that would have otherwise been used for smaller projects such as maintaining parks and redeveloping blighted areas of the city. Money from the redevelopment fund that currently provides an annual contribution to Santa Clara's general fund will no longer contribute to the general fund, which may require raising taxes in Santa Clara. Building this stadium will place the city of Santa Clara deeply in debt that will take decades to pay off. Also, with the state of the economy, it would be unwise to build a stadium considering people are losing their jobs and businesses are closing their doors in Santa Clara, and there will be even less money from taxes to help pay for the stadium. Santa Clara is already proposing to provide the land for the stadium for free. The owners of the 49ers are extremely rich, and should not receive a public subsidy to build a stadium. I do not want Santa Clara to provide a public subsidy for a stadium for the 49ers. Please consider the financial drawbacks of building a stadium in Santa Clara, and reconsider your position on the stadium issue.

A way of solving this issue could be to not build the stadium, and let another city (such as San Jose) which is larger, build the stadium because they will have enough revenue to build the stadium. It is very important that you consider this because it will financially cripple the city of San Jose. Also, there will be nothing to stop the 49ers from leaving the stadium after a few years, while the city of Santa Clara is still in huge debt from building the stadium. This has also happened to other cities that have been hurt because the teams that they built a stadium for left, leaving them in a huge debt that is taking them decades to pay off. 

Pop quiz: The 49ers' bid to build a new stadium in Santa Clara is: (A) dead; (B) dormant; or (C) juu-uust a bit delayed.

The bad news for the 49ers is that none of those options is tremendous for the ultimate finish line, yet there they are, clinging desperately to Answer C and hoping nobody notices that A or B look like your more operative choices.

The worse news for the 49ers brass is that the true Santa Clara status is "delayed until 2013, 2014 or 2015 at the earliest, with things turning bleaker at an algorithmic rate," but I couldn't fit that into the multiple-choice question.

Hey, give the 49ers credit: They're trying to keep a stiff upper lip about the whole thing, though they are under enormous time and financial pressure. "2012, I don't think we will hit," team president Jed York said Wednesday. "But Santa Clara remains our top priority and focus."

Good to know. Wouldn't want Mike Singletary to show up at the wrong field in September 2012. Smart to make that obvious concession. But once Santa Clara 2012 is no longer on the front burner, a whole lot of other issues come into play.

Issue No. 1: If the 49ers, by necessity, are going to keep playing at Candlestick for many more years, shouldn't they take a closer look at the nearby Hunters Point option?

Issue No. 2: If building in Santa Clara was always going to be complicated, why did the Yorks walk away from the 2006 negotiations for a new Candlestick in the first place? The 2006 talks had the good chance of an NFL loan (very iffy now in 2009), had the site locked up (which the 49ers do not yet have in Santa Clara), had a little momentum, and then "... dead. Why? Oh, yes, it seems so quaint now: John York didn't like the new Candlestick prospect of having the "world's largest garage" and was worried about all the construction around old Candlestick as the new one was built.

Issue No. 3: If it won't work in Santa Clara, and if the Yorks don't like what they see with the Hunters Point alternative "... where will the 49ers end up? OK, that last one is too heavy for the moment. It's the right question, but the 49ers have to play out this last act of Stadium Quest.

Jed York on Wednesday waved off presumptions that the team could turn most of its attentions back to an extensive Candlestick Park refurbishment, though York said the team, as it has in the past, will take a look at the viability of refurbishing Candlestick. A Candlestick refurbishment plan could be for the short- or long-term "if something doesn't happen in Santa Clara," York said, "but it's not our priority."

That focus is still squarely on Santa Clara, York said, with the environmental impact report well under way and talks continuing with the city on terms, pointing to a city election at some point this year. But that's presuming there's a fair, voter-friendly deal to be made with the city despite the recent economic turmoil and Cedar Fair's control of the preferred site.

That's also counting on the 49ers' ability to wait out the current credit crunch, then put together a responsible financing plan for their potential \$600 million to \$800 million share of the costs.

That's also assuming the 49ers can negotiate a flexible lease for Candlestick — their current deal lasts until 2012, and the team has options to extend it at five-year intervals, but would not want to be locked in through 2017 if Santa Clara is still viable.

That's a lot of assumptions, presumptions and guesses about Santa Clara. This is heading to the last act. It should only get more dramatic
