Dear Council Members:

I write on behalf of Silicon Valley Leadership Group regarding the San Francisco 49ers' proposal for a new stadium in Santa Clara and the net impact stadium financing will have on funds for affordable housing.

The Silicon Valley Leadership Group, founded in 1978 by David Packard of Hewlett-Packard, represents more than 250 of the Silicon Valley's most respected employers. Leadership Group members collectively provide nearly 250,000 local jobs, or one of every four private sector jobs in Silicon Valley.

Our members are interested in maintaining the presence of the San Francisco 49ers professional football team in the Bay Area, as the team is a regional economic and entertainment asset. The stadium and its ongoing maintenance and operations, including 49ers game use and other activities, are anticipated to spawn economic impacts in the hundreds of millions of dollars. Construction jobs are estimated at 700 per year for the duration of building. The team has developed a cost-sharing proposal for the stadium authority which is also anticipated to deliver net cash flow for the City.

While many matters remain to be resolved, from transportation and parking plans to final building costs, the team has laid out a very solid package that we support. Team owner John York has pledged to four principles regarding the stadium:

1. Significant team contribution (about 42.6% from team & NFL)
2. No new taxes on residents or businesses in Santa Clara
3. No negative net impact on Santa Clara's general fund
4. If cash reserves from Silicon Valley Power are used, it should not impact ratepayers

#### **Impact of Stadium Financing on Funds for Affordable Housing**


The Leadership Group has long been an advocate for affordable housing -- from spearheading Prop 1C (a \$2.85B bond dedicated to affordable housing) to founding the Housing Trust of Santa Clara County (a County-wide program that has helped over 6,200 families find homes in the Valley), to which the City has committed a total of \$1.5 million. In last year's annual Leadership Group CEO Business Climate Survey, the lack of affordable housing was again cited as the top concern of our valley's leading executives. And, we believe that the City has been an outstanding partner in this regard.

The City's commitment to meeting and exceeding the statutory set-aside for affordable housing is practically unparalleled. The City has gone above and beyond the call of duty to improve affordable housing by creating innovative programs such as the Below Market Purchase (BMP) Program that is designed to provide maximum value to homebuyers, minimizes the subsidy burden on homebuilders, and creates a mechanism for generating additional subsidy dollars for future affordable housing efforts. Moreover, the City's efforts to build affordable housing at the Bay Area Research & Extension Center (BAREC) demonstrate the dedication level that has not been matched by most cities.

It is our view that the City's commitment to affordable housing, in relation to the stadium proposal, will remain strong, like an A+ student earning an A grade.

We encourage Council Members to move forward with the two goals of financing the 49ers stadium to provide a significant economic boon to the City and entire Silicon Valley in the years to come and to continue to provide extraordinary support to affordable housing programs. Thank you for your consideration of our comments.
