

Redevelopment Agency to the City and Stadium Authority

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

The Redevelopment Agency of the City of Santa Clara (Agency) was created under the Community Redevelopment Law of the State of California. The Agency exists as a public body, separate and distinct from the City, for the purpose of redevelopment of blighted areas in the community, identified by appropriate proceedings set forth in the Community Redevelopment Law.

The Agency has two redevelopment project areas – the Bayshore North Project Area and the University Project Area. Completed redevelopment projects have included the Santa Clara Convention Center Complex, Great America Theme Park, Tasman Drive Bridge over the Guadalupe River, Youth Soccer Park, extension of the San Tomas Aquino Creek Trail, and the Convention Center Ballroom Expansion. Several other capital improvement projects have been created and appropriated but have not yet been completed. Examples include the Walsh Avenue Sanitary Sewer Improvements, Tasman Drive Parking Structure, Northside Branch Library, Agency Stadium Investment, and Downtown Revitalization CIP projects. These and other active Agency projects have been properly authorized and funded under Community Redevelopment Law and are in various stages of completion.

On February 8, 2011 and February 22, 2011, the Agency and the City authorized Cooperation Agreements whereby the City agreed to undertake responsibility for most of the Agency's projects in return for the Agency committing the required tax increment for such projects. The Agency and the Stadium Authority also took action on February 22, 2011 to approve a Cooperation Agreement related to stadium projects and subsequently approved clarifying changes to that Cooperation Agreement on February 28, 2011. The recommended action implements the Cooperation Agreements previously approved by moving the capital improvement projects included in the previously approved Cooperation Agreements to the entity that has assumed responsibility for such projects. Attachment 1 is a listing of all current active Agency capital improvement projects along with the identification of which entity they will be moving under by this action.

ADVANTAGES AND DISADVANTAGES OF ISSUE:

The recommended action would allow the City and the Stadium Authority to complete previously approved and appropriated Agency capital improvement projects in the event that proposed State legislation is adopted, and removes these projects from the uncertainty involved in working with the successor agencies proposed in the legislation. There are no disadvantages of this action.

ECONOMIC/FISCAL IMPACT:

This action will protect more than \$100 million of active Redevelopment Agency projects from possible termination by State of California action. Without this action the implementation of these projects would be subject to approval of the oversight board of the successor agency and may be at risk.

RECOMMENDATION:

- 1) That the Redevelopment Agency and the Stadium Authority approve the transfer of all stadium-related Agency capital improvement projects and remaining appropriations to the Stadium Authority per Attachment 1.
- 2) That the Redevelopment Agency and the Council approve the transfer of all non-stadium-related Agency capital improvement projects and remaining appropriations to the City per Attachment 1.

Affordable Housing

Securing Affordable Housing Funds

- RDA/CITY "Cooperation Agreement" (Feb 8, 2011) creates Agency indebtedness of housing funds to City. Commits tax increment revenue already received but unencumbered by any existing contractual obligation.
- CITY HOUSING AUTHORITY (Feb 22, 2011) created as separate entity. CHA controlled by Commission composed of Mayor & Council.
- RDA/CITY/CHA approve "Assignment & Assumption Agreement" (March 8, 2011) to transfer Cooperation Agreement to CHA.

Securing Affordable Housing Funds (Cont'd)

Purpose:

- Commits all unencumbered housing funds.
- Keeps decision-making authority with Council – not an "oversight board".

Securing Affordable Housing Lands

TRANSFER TITLE of three Agency-owned properties to Housing Authority:

- 3575 De La Cruz Blvd (former Fire Station #6) future site for Habitat for Humanity project;
- 611 El Camino Real site of HomeSafe Santa Clara transitional housing facility for victims of domestic violence (lease to 2055);
- San Tomas Expway-Monroe Street southwest corner site planning for development proposals expected summer 2011.
