PROPOSAL TO UPDATE MINIMUM WAGE ORDINANCE COMMUNITY OUTREACH MEETINGS & SURVEY

The City of Santa Clara is seeking feedback from the community for a proposed update to the City's minimum wage ordinance in order to be consistent with neighboring cities and to reach \$15 per hour by 2019.

Santa Clara's current local minimum wage went into effect on January 1, 2016, with an initial hourly rate of \$11.00 per hour and was increased on January 1, 2017 to \$11.10. California has increased its minimum wage to reach \$15 per hour by 2022 and seven of the 15 cities in Santa Clara County have adopted minimum wage increases to reach at least \$15 per hour by 2019.
