

**NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING AND AVAILABILITY FOR PUBLIC REVIEW**  
**Annual Plan for Program Year 2018-19 and**  
**Final Statement of Objectives and Proposed Uses of**  
**Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) and Home Investment Partnerships Act (HOME)**  
**Entitlement Funds**

The 2018-2019 Draft Annual Action Plan (Plan) provides a one-year plan in support of the City's Five-Year Consolidated Action Plan of 2015-2020. The Plan details how the City intends to invest its federal grant dollars to address the City's housing and community development needs. The estimated Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds include \$903,714 of annual entitlement dollars plus \$300,000 of program income for a total of \$1,203,714. The HOME Investment Partnerships (HOME) funds include an estimated \$299,478 plus \$100,000 of program income for a total of \$399,478. The development of this Plan is significantly informed by public feedback.

CDBG funds support non-profit public service agencies that provide programs benefiting low-income populations, and the city-run Neighborhood Conservation and Improvement Program (NCIP) which assists low-income homeowners in home rehabilitation efforts. HOME funds support the Tenant Based Rental Assistance program (TBRA) which provides rental subsidies to the City's homeless population, and the development of low-income housing.

A hearing on the City of Santa Clara's Annual Plan for Program Year 2018-19 Statement of Objectives and Proposed Uses of CDBG and HOME federal entitlement programs will be held on May 8, 2018 at 7:00 P.M. at the City Council Chambers, 1500 Warburton Avenue, Santa Clara, California. On April 4, 2018 the draft Plan will be available for examination by citizens, public agencies, and other interested parties at:

Written comments from the public on the Plan may be submitted prior to the Public Hearing to the Housing & Community Services Division offices at 1500 Warburton Avenue, Santa Clara, California 95050 or to [jveach@santaclaraca.gov](mailto:jveach@santaclaraca.gov) Persons wishing to present their views may also attend the Public Hearing to provide written and/or oral testimony regarding priorities and uses of the entitlement funds. The final Annual Plan will be submitted to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) by May 15, 2018 or by August 16, 2018 depending upon the date of Congressional appropriations for HUD funding.

In accordance with the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, the City of Santa Clara will ensure that all existing facilities will be made accessible to the maximum extent feasible. Reasonable modifications in policies, procedures and/or practices will be made as necessary to ensure full and equal access and enjoyment of all programs and activities for all individuals with a disability.
