

## CITY OF SANTA CLARA NOTICE OF TIME EXTENSION OF PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD DRAFT ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT REPORT FOR THE 49ers SANTA CLARA STADIUM PROJECT 4900 CENTENNIAL BOULEVARD, SANTA CLARA, CA 95054 Comment period close on September 28, 2009

TO: Responsible Agencies, Interested Parties, and Organizations

Purpose of a Draft Environmental Impact Report (DEIR): A Notice of Preparation (NOP) of a Draft Environmental Impact Report (DEIR) for the 49ers Santa Clara Stadium Project (SCH#2008082084 / PLN2008-06947 / CEQ2008-01060) was previously distributed to agencies, residents, and interested parties, which began a minimum 45-day public review and comment period on July 30, 2009. This notice is to announce that the comment period, which was set to end on September 14, 2009, has been extended by two weeks to September 28, 2009, to allow the public and agencies additional time to submit comments. This Environmental Impact Report (EIR) was prepared in compliance with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) of 1970, as amended through the Public Resources Code, Section 21000 et seq., and the State CEQA Guidelines, California Code of Regulations, Section 15000 et seq. The EIR is a full disclosure, public information document, in which the significant environmental impacts of a proposed project are evaluated, feasible measures to mitigate significant environmental effects are identified, and alternatives to the project that can reduce or avoid significant environmental effects are discussed.

Project Location: The project site is comprised of four separate properties along the San Tomas Aquino Creek channel, including the proposed stadium site, the proposed parking garage site, the existing substation, and the proposed substation receiver site, which total 40.3 acres. The stadium site is an approximate 22-acre parking lot located at the southwest corner of the intersection of Tasman Drive and Centennial Boulevard in the City of Santa Clara. The parking garage is proposed on a 2.0 acre parking lot that is part of a 4.0-acre site on the north side of Tasman Drive, adjoining San Tomas Aquino Creek to the east, and adjoining the Santa Clara Golf and Tennis Club (on the City landfill) to the south. The existing substation is on 2.10 acres located at the southwest corner of San Tomas Aquino Creek and Tasman Drive. The proposed substation receiver site is southeast of the stadium site, on a vacant portion of a 14.2-acre property occupied by the Silicon Valley Power's Northern Receiving Station. The off-site parking is proposed to be located in existing parking facilities throughout the industrial office area that surrounds the proposed stadium site. Rights to the parking would be secured by contractual arrangements for large stadium events.

**Project Description:** The applicant is requests a General Plan Text Amendment to the existing Tourist Commercial designation, a Redevelopment Plan Amendment, Rezoning to Planned Development (PD), and a parking variance, in order to allow the construction of a 68,500 seat open-air stadium, with possible expansion for up to 75,000 seats, for use by up to two National Football League (NFL) teams and other non-NFL events that are compatible with the type of venue proposed. Other uses could include concerts and non-football sporting events.

Summary of Significant Environmental Effects: Implementation of the proposed project would result in potentially significant and significant impacts in the following areas: aesthetic/visual; air quality; archaeological; biological resources; drainage/absorption; fiscal; flood plain/flooding; geologic/seismic; noise; public services/facilities; recreation/parks; sewer capacity; soil erosion/compaction/grading; solid waste; toxic/hazardous; traffic/circulation; vegetation; water supply/groundwater; wetland/riparian; land use; and cumulative effects.
