PUBLIC SCOPING MEETING for the 49ers Stadium Project Environmental Impact Report

PROJECT APPLICANT: San Francisco 49ers National Football League Team

The San Francisco 49ers NFL Football Team proposes to construct a football stadium for 68,500 seats (expandable up to 75,000 seats), on an existing parking lot in the vicinity of Tasman Drive and Centennial Boulevard in the City of Santa Clara. The proposed project would also include the construction of a new parking garage, and relocation of an existing electric substation. Approval of the proposed stadium and related facilities, including off-site event parking, will require actions by the City of Santa Clara, including the preparation and certification of an Environmental Impact Report (EIR) to support proposed zoning amendments and other entitlements.

As the Lead Agency, the City of Santa Clara will prepare an EIR for the above-referenced Project. The City is seeking the views of Responsible Agencies and the public as to **the scope and content** of the environmental information that should be considered for inclusion in the EIR for the proposed project.

The project description, location, and potential environmental effects are contained in the materials provided in the form of a Notice of Preparation (NOP). The NOP is available from the Planning Division Office at the address below, and is available on line at the City's website [www.santaclaraca.gov].

You may provide written comments and attend one of the following two EIR Scoping sessions:

Each session will be approximately one hour long and, following a presentation of the project description, will provide an opportunity for agencies and the public to identify issues that they believe should be addressed in the EIR that will be prepared for this project.
