1. Welcome

The Chair called the meeting to order at 4:06 p.m.

2. Brand Implementation Update

Staff updated the Committee regarding the branding initiative, including updated desktop and phone backgrounds at City workstations, the 2016 City Calendar and Annual Report, Inside Santa Clara, the Santa Clara Story Map outlining restaurants, hotels and places of interest and the 2015-16 budget brochure. In addition, the Super Community merchandise was highlighted, including t-shirts, sweatshirts and travel coffee tumblers. All merchandise is currently on sale at City Hall and will be available for purchase at the Super Community events.

3. SB50 Local Event Branding and Marketing Strategy

Articulate Solutions presented an update on brand implementation, such as newly designed street pole banners, a new banner for photograph opportunities in the Council Chambers, utilizing the digital billboard along Highway 101 near Great America and an insert within Discover Magazine, set to be distributed in February.

Articulate Solutions also presented some photographs from the selfie sleigh from the Super Community Tree Lighting and Ice Rink and provided an overview of all the marketing for the events, including flyers, social media, the website, television, and radio.

4. Update on Local Events for SB50

Commemorative Public Art: The commemorative art unveiling of "Anything's Possible" is scheduled for January 6, 2016 at 2 pm in front of Tasman Garage. Staff shared a few photographs of the sculptures.

Exhibit: The installation of Gridiron Glory will begin in January at Triton Museum of Art. The opening is scheduled for January 18, 2016.

5K/10K/Fun Run: The run is scheduled for January 10, 2016 and will finish on the 50 yard line inside Levi's Stadium. More information can be found at www.runsb50.com.

Concert & Fireworks: Heart has been confirmed as the headliner for the Concert on January 30, 2016 at Mission College. Staff is working on securing opening and community bands. Tickets will be available in the upcoming weeks.

Super Celebration: Huey Lewis and The News has been confirmed as the headliner for the concert at the Super Celebration on February 6, 2016 at Santa Clara University. Tickets will be available in the upcoming weeks.

STEM Innovation Bowl: The STEM Innovation Bowl will be on January 30, 2016 at Central Park Library. Seven companies have confirmed their presence and will be making presentations to attendees. The STEM Innovation Bowl will demonstrate the future of immersive technology and highlight virtual reality, augmented reality, telepresence robots, computer vision, 3D video, gaming and Santa Clara's interactive map tool, Map Santa Clara.

Volunteers: Staff is excited to have a pool of volunteers for all the Super Community events but are still looking for more assistance. To volunteer, register at www.santaclaraca.gov/volunteer. Staff is specifically looking for a large number of volunteers at the Super Celebration event at Santa Clara University on February 6, 2016.

5. Sponsorship Update

Kennedy Event Marketing updated the Committee on Super Community Event fundraising efforts. To date, the City has raised approximately \$390,000 and \$150,000 in in-kind donations. Kennedy Event Marketing will continue to work on securing Super Community sponsors.

The Chair adjourned the meeting at 5:35 p.m.

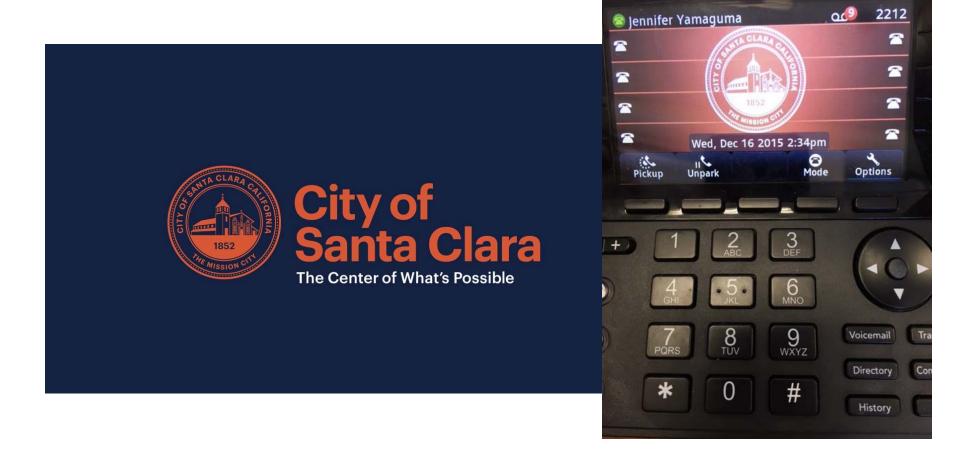

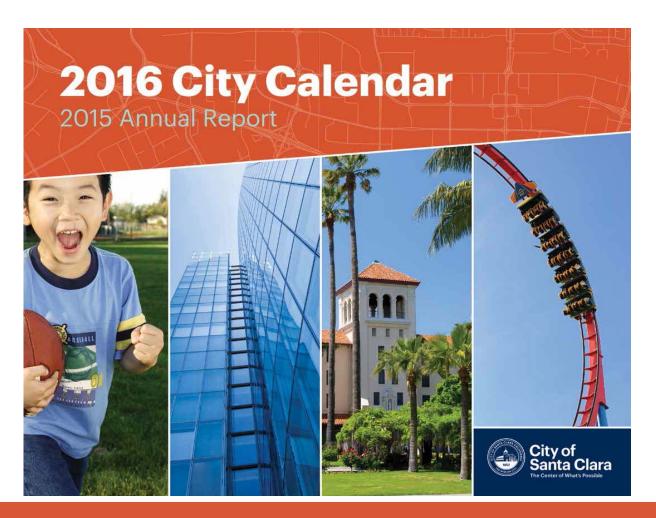

Santa Clara celebrates Super Bowl 50 with fun community events

Every Santa Clara resident will have the opportunity to experience the excitement of the 50th anniversary of the Super Bowl – even if not at the game at Levi's Stadium on February 7, 2016.



In the weeks leading up to one of the world's most highly anticipated sporting events, a series of community activities has been planned by the City of Santa Clara as part of a regional consortium with the National Football League, the Super Bowl 50 Host Committee and other cities to ensure that it is a spectacular event.

Santa Clara was appropriately the first official "Super Community" since the big game takes place here. Two years of planning have created a varied menu of activities for all ages. While visitors fill local hotels and restaurants counting down the days until kick off, Santa Clara residents can enjoy family-friendly events throughout their hometown created with their delight in mind.

Commemorative public art unveiling is Jan. 6

Artist Linda Serrao is accustomed to having her sculpture leave a lasting mark. The beautifully articulated bronze pieces are designed to be a legacy for a community to enjoy for generations to come.

What Linda didn't expect when she started the commemorative public art piece for the City of Santa Clara is that it would have such a personal impact on her.

Anything's Possible

For the past few months, Linda has been hard at work on "Anything's Possible," two life size bronze figures depicting a professional football player passing a football to a young awestruck fan. Both will be installed on a public walkway across from Levi's Stadium, with the unrelining scheduled for Jan. 6.

Linda begins her sculptures by working with a real life model and that led her to Ryan O'Haru, the quarterback football coach at Mt. San Antonio College in Walmut, California where she has her studio. Her original intent was to use the measurements of his athlete's body to create a "skeleton" for the sculpture moild. But along with information on the lengths of bones in his muscular arms and legs, she also learned about the intricacies of football and became an enthusiastic fan of O'Hara's college team. They formed a friendship bond

That unexpected outcome is what Linda hopes will be similar to what happens to people who see and interact with her sculpture. She looks forward to watching people touch the pieces, pose for selfie photos and be inspired by the sculpture to dream big about their future.

"It was clear from the beginning what the City was looking for," she said. "The art needed to celebrate Super Bowl 50 and to reflect the City's brand – the center of what's possible. It was easy to come up with the idea."

Creating the sculpture itself wasn't so easy. It's a long process involving many excruciatingly detailed steps before bronze is finally poured into a shell then produces the life size pieces.

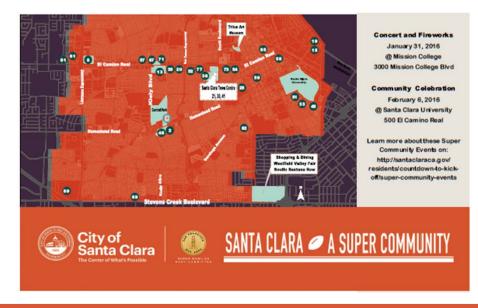
Capturing a moment in time

"Life size bronze sculptures are my passion," Linda said. "They are meant to capture a moment in time. Thousands of people will be passing by this sculpture during Super Bowl and millions more over the years. I hope it becomes a fond part of their memories of visiting Santa Clara and Levi's Stadium."

▲ A Balanced Budget

To ensure an open, efficient, and fiscally sound budget, the City Council held the following public meetings on the 2015-16 Budget: study sessions on May 19, 2015 and June 16, 2015, and a Public Hearing on June 16, 2015, Bollowing the Public Hearing, the Council adopted the fiscal year 2015-16 City budget of \$720.2 million, excluding the Successor Agency, Sports & Open Space Authority, Housing Authority, and Stadium Authority. This budget includes:

- \$ 647.3 million City Operating Budget (including the \$ 182.5 million General Fund Budget)
- \$ 72.9 million Capital Improvement Project Budget



Budget Highlights

The City's adopted budget for 2015-16 is \$720.2 million. This represents an increase of 9.0% from the fiscal year 2014-15 adopted budget of \$660.5 million. The increase is primarily the result of growth in funded positions, negotiated salary increases, and benefit cost increases; along with higher resource and production costs in the utility enterprise funds. Further review and explanation of the changes and funding impacts can be found later in this brochure and in the City Manager's Transmittal Letter of the 2015-16 Annual Budget document.

While actual costs are increasing, the City is taking steps to rebuild reserve levels by budgeting a contribution of \$7.0 million to the Working Canital Reserve

Santa Clara's Rates Are Still the Lowest in the Region!*
There is no change in Municipal Solar Utility rates for 2015-16. Rates that were changed include:

Electric Utility	up to 3.5% Increase (proposed for 1-1-2016)
Water Utility	\$4.32/month
Sewer Utility	\$3.29/month
Recycled Water Rate	10.8% depending on type of service
Garbage Collection and Disposal Rate	\$0.46/month
Clean Green Charge	\$0.22/month
Residential Curbside Recycling Rate	\$0.07/month
Clean-Up Campaign Charge	\$0.52/month
Storm Drain Rate	\$0.88/month

* The City of Santa Clara's combined refuse rates are still among the lowest in Santa Clara County and our combined water, sewer and electric rates remain the lowest in the nine (9) Bay Area counties.
