Ballot Measure: Council District Elections



Ballot Question

Shall the City Charter be amended: to establish two districts starting in 2018 to be represented by three Council Members each; and, when available, use ranked choice voting to allow voters to select candidates in order of choice to determine the winners of elections of all city elected officers?



Proposed Charter Election Provisions

- Two Council Districts
- Each district shall be represented by 3 Council Members
- In 2018, elect two members to four-year terms in District 1
- In 2020, elect one member to a two-year term in District 1 and three members to four-year terms in District 2
- In 2022, elect 3 Council Members to District 1
- In 2024, elect 3 Council Members to District 2



City Ordinance: Council Districts & District Boundaries



Districting: Statutory Criteria

- Districts shall contain a nearly equal population;
- Complies with the Federal Voting Rights Act and the Equal Protection Clause of the U.S. Constitution; and
- In establishing boundaries of the districts, the council may give consideration to the following factors: (1) topography, (2) geography, (3) cohesiveness, contiguity, integrity, and compactness of territory, and (4) community of interest of the districts.



Districting: Statutory Criteria

- Must hold 4 public hearings (Election Code Section 10010):
 - 2 prior to map boundary being drawn (within 30 days)
 - 2 after the map boundary is drawn (within 45 days)
- Boundary changes must occur no less than 125 days before an election for the boundary changes to be effective (Election Code Section 12262)



Potential Sequencing

- The proposed Charter Amendment sets forth that District 1 shall go first in 2018, so Committee's recommendation must include which map and which district in that map will be designated as District 1
- In considering which district will be District 1, the Committee must give special consideration to the purposes of the California Voting Rights Act, and shall take into account the preferences expressed by members of the districts
 - Purpose of CVRA: remove impediments to the ability of minority voters to influence elections (e.g., elect candidates of its choice)



Role of the Committee

- The role of the Committee is to:
 - Hold the required 4 public hearings
 - Listen to and consider all the input received from the public
 - Review the demographer's recommendations, and
 - Provide a recommendation on a draft map indicating two districts, and which district to be designated as District 1 and 2 for purposes of sequencing

Districting Plans - Legal Requirements

1. Balance the 2010 Census total population between two Council districts.

Each district must have approximately half of the City's total 2010 population: 116,468/2 = 58,234. Overall plan deviations must not exceed 5,823 (10 percent of the ideal size).

2. Provide groups protected under the Federal Voting Rights Act with the opportunity to elect representatives of their choice.

We measure "opportunity to elect" using the group's share of those eligible to vote: the Citizen Voting Age Population, or CVAP. Under the Ranked Choice Voting Single Transferrable Vote system, a protected group's CVAP would need to be 25% (plus one person) or more of the Council district's total CVAP in order to have the opportunity to elect representatives of their choice.



Census block)



CVAP rates were derived from estimates in a special tabulation of American Community Survey 2012-16 data by the U.S. Census Bureau and applied to Census 2010 voting age population (VAP) totals, by race/ethnicity. These estimates are from small samples and are inexact.



Three Draft Plans

Method used to create districting scenarios

- Combine "Pieces" to form districts, taking into account:
 - Total 2010 population
 - CVAP estimates
 - Estimated post-2010 population growth from new housing
- "Pieces" were drawn while taking into account:
 - Major thoroughfares
 - Neighborhoods
 - Election precinct boundaries
 - Santa Clara Unified School District's elementary attendance areas
- More about "Pieces"
 - They do not have equal populations; instead, they are intended to be useful for building Council districts
 - Boundaries can be adjusted--subdivided or revised--if it seems useful to do so
 - We have estimated post-2010 population growth from new housing, and have counts for each "piece". Note that population changes occur in areas with no new housing.




Three Draft Plans

Plan deviation:


2010 = 0.05%

2010 = 7.0%


2017 (estimated) = 14.1%*







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



Draft Plans with Santa Clara Unified School District Elementary Attendance Areas





