

City Manager's Annual Report



Dear Community,

When Santa Clara residents gather – whether it's for a fun event or a serious discussion of a community issue – there is always a common denominator: we love Santa Clara. We not only hear these words, we see these feelings in action as residents participate in government, volunteer in the community, and boast to family and friends about the quality of life in the city they have chosen to call home.

In 2019, the City had an ambitious workplan of projects, programs and policies designed to enhance Santa Clara today and protect its future. We have successfully accomplished many of these goals and others are in progress. We do not take lightly the trust and confidence of our residents in preserving in Santa Clara the assets that the community loves. Plus, chamberofcommerce.org gave Santa Clara top honors as California's most livable city for 2019.

We start 2020 with a distinctive honor. Santa Clara will be featured in the January issue of *Business View Magazine* for "Best Practices of Cities and City Management." This publication has 850,000 subscribers in the North America continent who will read about the great work we have achieved.

We Are Thriving

Santa Clara continues to grow and thrive. Unanimously supported by the Downtown Task Force, the City Council approved a consultant contract to develop the Downtown Specific Plan. The process is also starting to develop a Civic Center Master Plan to address space and capacity needs. Additionally, construction started in 2019 on Related Santa Clara, the large-scale, mixed use development across from Levi's® Stadium that will offer new residential, shopping, dining, entertainment, public park, and job opportunities to the Santa Clara community.

Additional Highlights of 2019

- The Santa Clara Fire Department achieved full accreditation – a recognition granted only 10% of fire departments in the U.S.
- Several neighborhood parks received upgrades. The new Reed & Grant Streets Sports Park, a facility eagerly awaited by the community, will open in early 2020.
- New communication tools were put into place to increase transparency and make it easier for the public to access information, including NextRequest, a public records online portal.
- A new management team was selected for the Santa Clara Convention Center.
- A comprehensive update to the City Zoning Code was started in 2019. It is the first significant reorganization of its content and format in 50 years.
- Santa Clara ranked #1 best city to live in California by ChamberofCommerce.org.
- Santa Clara named 6th safest city in America by SmartAsset.

Solid Financial Foundation

At the top of the list of accomplishments is our significantly improved fiscal outlook. Two years ago, the City forecasted a \$78 million budget deficit for Fiscal Years 2018 through 2021. Through meticulous diligence in reviewing all funds, revenue assumptions and expenditure controls, and validating each line item in the budget, we were able to eliminate the budget deficit, save hundreds of City jobs, and preserve high quality service levels. In addition, we have built our reserves to an unprecedented level. Key reserves now total just over \$340 million, a level never experienced in Santa Clara history.

Supporting Our Workforce

A high-performing organization relies on its people, and we have given our workforce special consideration as our most valuable resource. In 2019, we conducted the first employee survey to better understand their opinions, perspectives and concerns. The results were gratifying. More than 90% felt that their job supports the City's overall goals and priorities and that they have ample opportunities to provide input when major decisions are made. A vast majority of survey respondents also believe that the City has a positive relationship with its residents and that it plays an important role in the community.

We will continue to track through data-driven research how our residents and employees feel about the decisions and actions of the Council and City administration. It is important to us to know we are on the right track and reflect the values and priorities of those we serve.

The City has under consideration nearly 30,000 housing units at different stages of review and/or construction, including several hundred that will be affordable.

Protecting the Environment

With our eyes on the lives of future generations, the City Council added "sustainability" as a strategic goal. The first ever Sustainability Manager will coordinate citywide efforts to implement the City's Climate Action Plan to keep our environment healthy and safe. During the year it celebrated the 15th anniversary of the highly successful Green Power Program, Silicon Valley Power, the City's municipal energy utility, racked up several more national awards for its record in providing reliable and safe electric service.

During this past year and throughout my tenure as your City Manager, it has been an absolute honor and delight to work with the community, employees, and the City Council to advance the goals and priorities of the City of Santa Clara. In June 2019, the City of Santa Clara adopted its first biennial operating budget for a two-year period, July 1, 2019, through June 30, 2021. The City's annual operating budget of \$1.04 billion provides funding for all City services, infrastructure investments and activities.

Total Revenue and Other Financing Resources \$1.038.6 Revenues come from a variety of sources including: local property and sales tax; licenses and permits such as building and development fees; charges for services; and other smaller sources of revenue such as rent and interest on investments. What you should know about property tax and sales tax

Although they are both important sources of revenue, only a small portion of property tax and sales tax goes to the City of Santa Clara.

- The City of Santa Clara receives \$10.24 of every \$100 collected in property tax.
- The City of Santa Clara receives \$1 of every \$9 of sales tax collected.





The Cleanup Campaign is a service for the residents of the City of Santa Clara, not for people from other communities, contractors or businesses. Call 408-615-3080 weekdays or 408-615-5580 after 4:30 p.m. or on weekends if you witness illegal dumping in progress.

DO NOT set out your materials before the specified dates. Early set-outs are subject to a **\$150** fine.

Place materials only in front of your address and at least 3 feet from any obstructions such as fire hydrants, fences, poles, cars, trees, bushes or walls. **DO NOT** block sidewalks or bike lanes.

Not all developments participate in the Cleanup Campaign. Unsure about your area or where to place your items? Contact 408-615-3080.

ACCEPTED MATERIALS

- Bulky items such as old furniture, carpets, mattresses, toilets, foam packaging, etc.
- Appliances, tires, e-waste (anything that requires a plug or battery to operate), fencing, branches and brush (no longer than 6 feet in length).
 Separate each of these types of materials for special collection.
- All concrete, asphalt, dirt, brick, rocks, drywall and/or sawdust MUST be set out in a heavy duty bulk bag no larger than 1 cubic yard to prevent potential stormwater runoff pollution. Failure to use a bulk bag for these items is subject to a \$150 fine. Bulk bags may be purchased at a retailer of your choice or at the City Hall Utility Payment Window, 1500 Warburton Ave., starting April 6. A total of 1 cubic yard of bagged debris will be picked up at no charge. Additional bagged cubic yards will be assessed at \$25/cubic yard.


ITEMS NOT ACCEPTED

- Recyclable materials. Use the weekly curbside recycling collection for these items. For information on curbside recycling, visit SantaClaraCA.gov/CleanSC.
- Contractor-generated landscape or construction/demolition debris.
- Household hazardous waste such as paint, chemicals, automotive fluids, solvents, fertilizers, cleaning products, compact fluorescent light bulbs (CFLs), batteries or sharps. Illegal set-out of hazardous materials is subject to a \$500 fine.

- **Salvageable items** that could be reused or recycled. Instead, visit RecycleStuff.org or call 1-800-533-8414 for more information.
- Ammunition and explosives. For safe disposal, call the Santa Clara Police Department at 408-615-5580.
- Medications. Safely dispose of expired or unwanted medications at the MED-Project kiosks located throughout the City. For additional information and a list of locations, visit SCCMEDS.org.




