



POLICE BLOTTER

Week of November 1, 2020



The Police Blotter highlights a partial list of incidents in the city and is distributed on a weekly basis. The Blotter provides the date, time, approximate location, a narrative summary of the incident, case number and the most serious arrest charge.

Meanwhile, the Arrest Log provides a timely, chronological summary of all the arrests made by the Santa Clara Police Department. It includes the name of the suspect(s), date of birth, city in which they reside, arrest date, time, location, case number as well as all the charge(s) associated with the arrest. This information, located on the Santa Clara Police Department's home page (www.scpd.org), is updated daily and serves as the most comprehensive list of arrests made.

Based on the mandatory orders from Santa Clara County Public Health, the City of Santa Clara has implemented many service level changes, limited to essential services. Since the preparation and distribution of a Police Blotter is not an essential service, it will be produced as resources are available.

Sunday, November 1, 2020

Residential Burglary Location: 900 Block of Kiely Boulevard An unknown subject(s) entered an unlocked rear patio door and made entry to a residence on the 900 block of Kiely Boulevard.

The subject(s) stole an item, however at the time of this report the total loss is unknown.

Monday, November 2, 2020

Identification Theft Location: 3500 Block of Agate Drive

An officer on routine patrol conducted a registration check on a vehicle. The return indicated the registration was expired yet the vehicle displayed a current registration tab. The officer followed the vehicle into a parking lot on the 3500 block of Agate Drive and approached the male driver (subject #1) as he exited the vehicle. Another male subject (subject #2) jumped out of the vehicle and ran into the complex. Subject #1 told the officer he locked the keys in his vehicle and did not have a spare.

On contact, subject #1 informed the officer that he was on probation. The probation terms were confirmed via a Records check as well as a felony warrant. Meanwhile, the officer observed drug paraphernalia in plain view in the vehicle. Subject #1 was detained in handcuffs.

Subject #1 informed officers that a spare vehicle key could be obtained from his fiancée in their apartment. An officer went to the apartment, also on the 3500 block of Agate Drive, to make contact with the subject's fiancée. In doing so, the officer could see a male subject, later determined to be subject #2, attempting to hide inside the apartment. Meanwhile, subject #1's fiancée (subject #3) stated she did not have any keys -and refused to open the door. A Records check advised that subject #3 was on Post Release Community Supervision with search terms.

A probation search of subject #1's vehicle yielded controlled substances, a United States Postal key, a credit card that did not belong to the subject and several documents of mail. A probation search of the apartment yielded numerous checks, credit cards, blank check paper, DMV paper for printing and identification cards that belonged to other people, laptops, cell phones and \$3,985 in various denominations. Subject #2 and #3 were hailed from the apartment. Eventually, subject #1 and #3 were cited and released with a Notice to Appear.

Prowling Location: 1400 Block of Bowe Avenue

A resident on the 1400 block of Bowe Avenue received a video alert of a subject attempting to open a car door in a carport and attempting to gain entry to the residence. The reporting party sent an email with video of the incident to the Police Department. No calls were received to report the incident. The subject is unknown and at large.

Parole Violation Location: 1100 Block of Lily Avenue

An officer observed a vehicle fail to stop at a stop sign at the intersection of White Oak Lane and Lily Avenue. The officer initiated a traffic enforcement stop.

The officer contacted the vehicle's occupants, a female driver and male passenger. A Records check revealed the male subject was on parole. A search of the vehicle yielded personal identifying information, altered checks, drug paraphernalia and a controlled substance.

The female subject was issued a citation for the traffic violation and released at the scene. The male subject was primarily responsible for the items in the vehicle, was arrested and transported to the Santa Clara County Jail.

When the employee was looking for the item, the subject took the employee's iPad (valued at \$800) and left the store. The subject rode away on a bicycle and remains unknown and at large.

Petty Theft Location: International Swim Center, 2625 Patricia Drive Public Safety Dispatchers received a call for service regarding a prior theft at the International Swim Center, located at 2625 Patricia Drive.

The victim parked an unlocked vehicle in the swim center parking lot adjacent to an occupied parked vehicle. The male subject in the adjacent car opened the victim's car door, grabbed a purse and fled the scene. The subject is unknown and at large.

Saturday, November 7, 2020

Driving Under the Influence Location: 3700 Block of Thomas Road A reporting party witnessed a vehicle driving erratically on Highway 101, across all three lanes of traffic at well below freeway speeds. The reporting party followed the subject as he exited onto Montague Expressway and came to rest on the 3700 block of Thomas Road.

The subject vehicle was running when the officer made contact with the male driver. The subject exited the vehicle and displayed objective symptoms of alcohol intoxication. The subject unsuccessfully performed the Standardized Field Sobriety Tests. Meanwhile, a Records check revealed the subject had a suspended driver's license and -was currently on court probation. He was arrested and transported to the Santa Clara County Jail.
