



POLICE BLOTTER

Week of November 29, 2020



The Police Blotter highlights a partial list of incidents in the city and is distributed on a weekly basis. The Blotter provides the date, time, approximate location, a narrative summary of the incident, case number and the most serious arrest charge.

Meanwhile, the Arrest Log provides a timely, chronological summary of all the arrests made by the Santa Clara Police Department. It includes the name of the suspect(s), date of birth, city in which they reside, arrest date, time, location, case number as well as all the charge(s) associated with the arrest. This information, located on the Santa Clara Police Department's home page (www.scpd.org), is updated daily and serves as the most comprehensive list of arrests made.

Based on the mandatory orders from Santa Clara County Public Health, the City of Santa Clara has implemented many service level changes, limited to essential services. Since the preparation and distribution of a Police Blotter is not an essential service, it will be produced as resources are available.

Sunday, November 29, 2020

Felony Evading Location: Great America Parkway and Old Glory Way Approximately 200 - 300 vehicles arrived in the area of Great America Parkway and Old Glory Way, blocked the intersection and began driving recklessly, performing stunts among spectators known as a sideshow. Officers responded to the area with lights and sirens activated and were ignored by participants. When the officers attempted to stop the activity, drivers backed up, went around the police vehicles and/or sped away, some against traffic. Many of the vehicles had duct tape covering their license plates, or no license plate.

In recent weeks, such participants have gathered in various locations throughout our city. On police arrival, participants have become aggressive, throwing rocks, bottles and pointing lasers at officers. Illegal sideshow activity has the potential to lead to serious injuries and can be a significant draw on police resources.

Our Department recognizes illegal sideshow activity is not unique to our city and is a regional issue that negatively affects our neighborhoods, businesses and quality of life. To mitigate the matter, officers have been conducting preemptive policing in the trouble areas in our city. In addition, the Police Department continues to work with its law enforcement partners throughout the region to share intelligence, issue citations, seize vehicles, make arrests and find long term solutions to illegal sideshows.

Monday, November 30, 2020

Theft Location: El Camino Real and Monroe Street
Between 1340 hours and 1350 hours, an unidentified subject approached a victim out for a walk on El

Camino Real near Monroe Street.

The subject placed two fake gold necklaces around the victims' neck and tried to get the victim to paly for the items. The victim declined. While doing so, the subject stole the gold necklace the victim was wearing, valued at approximately \$600. The subject hugged the victim and drove away on northbound Monroe Street.

Warrant Location: 3100 Block of El Camino Real

An officer patrolling the area of El Camino Real and Calabazas Boulevard and came across three male subjects in the alley. The officer-initiated contact.

A Records check revealed one of the subjects had two misdemeanor warrants. The subject was arrested without incident and booked into the Santa Clara County Jail.

Wednesday, December 2, 2020

Violation of Court Order Location: 2900 Block of El Camino Real

Public Safety Dispatchers received an open line 9-1-1 call. During the call, a male voice could be heard yelling and a female crying. A few seconds later the call disconnected. Public Safety Dispatchers attempted to call the phone number back, however there was no answer.

Communications Center technology helped Public Safety Dispatchers determine the call may be coming from the 2900 block of El Camino Real and deployed an officer to investigate the situation. Meanwhile, a Records check on the phone number revealed the potential names connected with the cell phone, one male and one female.

A Records check of the names revealed the male subject had two served domestic violence protective orders, two misdemeanor and one felony arrest warrants. Records personnel were also able to provide the responding officer with an old booking photo.

The officer approached the staff of a nearby motel and determined the subject was an occupant. The subject was in an adjacent parking lot sitting inside a vehicle. He was detained while another officer located the female victim in the motel room. A search yielded drug paraphernalia and a controlled substance.

The duo had been occupants of the motel for approximately one month and she contacted Public Safety Dispatchers during a heated argument. He was arrested and transported to the Santa Clara County Jail.

Grand Theft Location: 3000 Block of Stevens Creek Boulevard
Public Safety Dispatchers received a call for service regarding a male subject being detained by Loss
Prevention Specialists on the 3000 block of Stevens Creek Boulevard.

The subject was observed selecting items from multiple department, passed open cash registers and left the store with 11 stolen items in his possession. The subject was approached and detained by Loss Prevention Specialists. The items were valued at \$1,366.99 and were recovered.

The subject lied about his identity to arriving officers. Through investigation, officers learned his name and determined he is on Post Release Community Supervision. He was arrested, processed at the Police Department's Temporary Holding Facility and released on his own recognizance.

Driving Under the Influence Location: 1900 Block of Scott Boulevard

An officer observed a vehicle pull out of a driveway on the 3500 block of Monroe Street at a high rate of speed. The officer caught up to the vehicle near Monroe Street at San Tomas Expressway and initiated a traffic enforcement stop. The vehicle eventually came to a stop on the 1900 block of Scott Boulevard.

On contact the male driver showed symptoms of being under the influence of an alcoholic beverage. A Records check revealed the subject had a suspended driver's license. The subject performed the Standardized Field Sobriety Tests and a Preliminary Alcohol Screening test was administered. The readings were 0.177% and 0.172%.

The driver was arrested without incident and transported to the Santa Clara County Jail.

The responding officer contacted the subject utilizing the AT&T language translation service. The subject admitted to the petty theft, estimated at \$328, as well as a similar incident a few days prior. Combined, the loss is approximately \$1,068. The subject received a citation and was released at the scene.
