Santa Clara Scores a Touchdown with 2019 College Football Playoff National Championship

Santa Clara Stadium Authority's approval of an agreement between the Forty Niners Management Company and the Bay Area Host Committee covered expenses and safeguarded against negative fiscal impact

SANTA CLARA, Calif. – Hosted at Levi's® Stadium, the 2019 College Football Playoff (CFP) National Championship had rain-free weather and enthusiastic Alabama and Clemson fans for the game held in Santa Clara on Monday, Jan. 7. Starting last Friday, Jan. 4, there were a series of events held in both Santa Clara and San José to lead up to the championship game, which was televised by ESPN to a national audience.

According to media reports, the Bay Area Host Committee (BAHC), a nonprofit mutual benefit corporation, is expected to lose between \$8-12 million for hosting the event whereas the economic impact to the region through hotel stays, restaurant visits, retail spending and more is unknown at this time. While the financial returns from CFP are still being calculated, the Santa Clara Stadium Authority (Stadium Authority) will have all CFP-related expenses, such as public safety, fully reimbursed. That's due to the Stadium Authority approving an Assumption Agreement between the Forty Niners Stadium Management Company and the BAHC on July 17, 2018. The agreement passed along all financial risk to the BAHC which is affiliated with the San Francisco 49ers.

"Having the College Football Playoff National Championship in Santa Clara was a win," said Stadium Authority Board Chair/Santa Clara Mayor Lisa M. Gillmor. "Knowing that millions of dollars of public money were at stake by hosting this event, the Board successfully negotiated an unprecedented agreement with the Bay Area Host Committee and the San Francisco Forty Niners to cover all of our costs and allow us to share in the net revenue."

In addition, through the agreement, BAHC will:

- Pay for all CFP-related expenses including non-Game Day, and all pre-, during- and after-event costs, and up to double-time pay for public safety costs on event day;
- Provide a complete accounting of all revenue and expenses, and possession of supporting documentation for the CFP event and BAHC's annual financial audits for the fiscal years that contain Stadium Authority-related expenses.

For CFP, the Stadium Authority decided against absorbing the magnitude of the projected loss through City subsidies.

In 2018, the Atlanta CFP game resulted in local subsidies of approximately \$12-14 million.
