# **Project Overview**

# **Parking Study Objectives**

- In July 2018, City Council approved a proposed 12 unit townhome project at 1900 Warburton Avenue. Local residents voiced concerns about current and future parking conditions in the area.
- City Council heard the community's concerns and on March 26, 2019 approved a budget to complete a parking study to identify current parking conditions and develop potential solutions.
- On May 9, 2019, community intake meeting regarding Parking Study.
- Develop immediate, near-term, and potential long-term recommendations based on parking surveys results and community feedback.



# **1900 Warburton Avenue Project**

- Proposed Project:
  - 12 Townhomes
  - 2 Garage Spaces per Unit
  - 24 Residential Parking spaces
  - 6 Guest Spaces
  - Satisfies City Code





# Community Meeting #1 - May 9, 2019

- Feedback Provided by Community:
  - Lack of parking during evening hours
  - Insufficient off-street parking supply for properties (garage spaces)
  - Underutilized parking spaces on Lincoln Street
  - Illegally parked commercial vehicles
  - Residents often have to park relatively far from their property
  - Proposed project could exacerbate existing conditions





# **Civic Center Study Area**

Parking Surveys were conducted: May 1, 2019 – May 3, 2019 (Wednesday – Friday)

Time periods surveyed:

Mid-Day (11:00 a.m. and 12:00 p.m.)

Overnight (1:00 a.m. and 2:00 a.m.)

12 Street Segments – 426 spaces 8 Parking Lots – 550 spaces 986 total spaces




# **Parking Survey Results**

- Parking usage was consistent with typical parking demand of similar land uses (i.e. multi-family residential, etc).
- Peak parking demand was between 1:00 and 2:00 a.m.
- Off-Street (Private):
  - Vehicles parked in undesignated places within parking garages.
- On-Street (Public):
  - Scott Boulevard consistently recorded a relatively low overall parking occupancy
  - East side of Lincoln Street a relatively low average parking occupancy
  - Civic Center Drive, Don Court, and Don Avenue exhibited relatively high average parking occupancy



# **Parking Survey Results**

### Peak Parking Demand vs Capacity between 1:00 and 2:00 a.m.





### Recommendations

### **Immediate**

Use MySantaClara app to report illegally parked vehicles

### **Near-Term**

- Additional On-Street Parking Restrictions
- Residential Permit Parking Program

## **Long-Term**

- Potential diagonal parking on Lincoln Street (requires lane removal)
- Shared parking strategy between various uses in study area (Temporary Solution)
- Review and potentially revise Parking Code for developments
