Criterias to focus on for adopting a new district map -

Must have-

- Keep percent deviation below 10% (but not try to minimize) and keep map contiguous & compact
- 2. Keep communities of interests/concern intact

Nice to Have-

- 3. Minimize number of people who have to wait for 6 years to vote
- 4. Attempt to minimize percent deviation in next census by predictingby looking at City Clara Development plan -

Data to be provided by the demographers -

- 1. List of all the maps proposed so far (Maps 1 to 10) with visual representation of neighborhoods, racial/ethnicity data
- 2. Summary of population changing election districts, years until next election, & Plan deviation

Review criteria for Commissioners -

- 1. Analyze all the maps provided by the demographers
- 2. Try to get your questions about submitted maps answered before the next meeting if possible
- 3. Shortlist 2 maps to discuss and modify in the next meeting
- 4. List of strong 'No' or 'Must haves' for their districts or the city in general

District 1 development data:

In Pieces 2, 3 and 7 at least 4473 residential units are potentially going to come up.

Assuming an average of 1.5 persons in each residential unit, we are expecting at least 6708 new residents in District 1.
