Santa Clara Watering Restricted to 2 Days Per Week

Due to the ongoing severe drought in Santa Clara County and most of California, City Council passed Resolution 22-9077 on April 19, 2022, restricting outdoor watering to 2 days per week.



- Odd numbered addresses and sites with no addresses may water Monday and Thursday.
- Even numbered addresses may water Tuesday and Friday.

City of Santa Clara receives Arbor Day Foundation's Tree City Recognition and Growth Award

For its commitment to managing, expanding, and preserving our urban forest, the City of Santa Clara has been designated by the Arbor Day Foundation as a Tree City USA community 35 times in a row! In addition, Santa Clara was one of 15 California cities recently recognized with the prestigious Growth Award. This marks the 22-time Santa Clara has received this distinguished award. The Growth Award recognizes major milestones and annual activities that build sustainable community forestry programs. Santa Clara recognizes that a thriving urban forest offers many advantages to the community and that the trees we plant now show our commitment to the environment and future generations.

Pruneridge Avenue Complete Streets Plan

On **Thursday, May 12, 6 to 7:30 p.m.**, the City will host an additional virtual community meeting for the Pruneridge Avenue Complete Streets Plan (Plan) project. The goal of the Plan is to study and identify potential bicycle and pedestrian improvements on a 2.2-mile segment of Pruneridge Avenue from Pomeroy Avenue to Winchester Boulevard. The City will present an additional draft concept developed to minimize congestion impacts and improve walking and bicycling along the corridor. The Plan's four draft concepts include options for parking removal or lane reductions. Hello District 1 Residents!

April showers bring May flowers
- and allergies. I am glad the
Bay Area received a few needed
showers this past month. The
City of Santa Clara reminds us of
these water saving requirements:

- Restrict outdoor watering to a maximum of two (2) days per week for all customers
- Odd numbered addresses and sites with no addresses can water: Monday and Thursday
- Even numbered addresses can water: Tuesday and Friday
- Irrigation is not allowed between the hours of 9 a.m. 6 p.m.
- Watering lawns is not allowed during or within 48 hours after measurable precipitation.

Also, washing any vehicle using a hose without an operating automatic shut-off valve (a squeeze trigger is an example of an automatic shut-off valve). You can pick up a free garden hose nozzle from the City's Water and Sewer Department to save water. Car washes are another option as they use recycled water.

Sam Pisaro (Coach/




Baseball), Stephanie Silva (Softball) and Lu Tang (Tennis).


The City has held three community meetings to get input regarding potential changes to the Annual Clean-up Campaign to make it better and more accessible for residents as not every community participates due to streets being too



narrow or not having access to frontage streets for pick-up. The City's Public Works Department is considering options working with Mission Trail Waste Systems in creating a better program and plans to bringing potential changes/plans to the City Council later this year. We need to find better ways to keep our streets clean and keep illegal dumping like what I saw this morning from happening.

It looks like the coyotes are back in Ulistac after being gone for a

few months. From talking to volunteers at Ulistac, the usual two coyotes may have been off mating and now returned. I recently literally ran into the two coyotes early in the morning while walking my dog in Ulistac and again while walking along the San Jose side of the Guadalupe River - again



early in the morning. The coyotes are usually seen at dawn and dusk and occasionally during the day. Signs have been placed in Ulistac to alert residents and how to react if you see a coyote. The coyotes will not bother you if you don't bother them. This is a natural habitat for them. However, I will add to please not feed them. If you live near Ulistac or the Guadalupe River, please do not leave food outside that might attract the coyotes to the residential

neighborhoods.

SB 9: California HOME Act

Senate Bill 9 (SB 9) was signed into law by Governor Newsom on September 16, 2021 and became effective on January 1, 2022. For projects that meet specific eligibility criteria, SB 9 requires ministerial review and approval of a housing development with no more than two primary dwelling units on a single-family (R1) zoned property, the subdivision of an R1 zoned parcel, or both. Ministerial review of an SB 9 application means a process without discretionary review or hearing, where City staff is limited to ensuring that the proposed development meets all eligibility criteria and applicable objective zoning, subdivision, and design review standards. The Planning Commission and City Council will be considering an amendment to Title 18 of the Santa Clara City Code (Zoning) to add a new chapter implementing the provisions of SB 9 with additional objective zoning and design standards to address parking, urban lot split standards, privacy, and neighborhood compatibility. City of Santa Clara Zoning Code Update

The City's existing code was developed in March 1969 and does not reflect the recently adopted Santa Clara 2010-2035 General Plan. This update will make the code consistent with state and federal law and the direction provided in the 2010–2035 General Plan. A public review draft of the Zoning Code is available now through June 6, 2022. Study sessions will be held with the City Council in late Spring 2022 and adoption hearings will be held in late Summer 2022.

Lafayette Bike Lane Project and Pedestrian Enhancement Community Meeting

The City is working on two projects on Lafayette Street. The first project is grant funded and is looking at options to install new protected bicycle lanes on Lafayette Street between Laurelwood Road and Reed Street. As part of this project, the City is considering the removal of parking on Lafayette Street between Memorex Drive and Parker Court. There will be a community meeting on Wednesday, May 4, 6 to 7:30 p.m. to present the project scope, discuss possible parking removals on Lafayette Street, and gather community input. The second project is related to potential pedestrian improvements at the existing crosswalk on Lafayette Street at Parker Court. The City will also present information about potential improvements at this crosswalk. The public is invited to attend this online community meeting and provide feedback. PG&E Gas Construction on Lafayette Street and Montague Expressway

Beginning April 25, 2022 through June 2022, PG&E will begin work to replace infrastructure and equipment associated with their natural gas line facilities on Lafayette Street and Montague Expressway in Santa Clara. PG&E has indicated that this work should not interrupt gas service. However, residents may occasionally hear some noise and smell natural gas as PG&E empties pipelines in a safe and controlled manner. To facilitate this project, temporary lane closures will occur nightly on southbound Lafayette Street during the coming weeks and into June. During these closure periods, residents may encounter detours along Lafayette Street and will be directed to alternate routes. Hours of work will be Sunday-Friday, 8 p.m. - 6 a.m. For more

Learn How to Cook with Induction Technology

As a part of our efforts to reducing greenhouse gas emissions, improve the environment, and support energy efficient technologies, Silicon Valley power upgraded Santa Clara Unified School District's Adult Education cooking classroom with induction



cooktops so that students can experience cooking on this new technology. Induction cooktops are faster and more efficient than cooking with a gas or traditional electric stove. They only heat the cookware, not the surrounding area, and there is no exposed flame, so they're safer too. You can learn more about induction cooktops and try cooking with the technology yourself at one of several cooking classes offered throughout the year through Santa Clara Adult Education. 

Annual Cleanup Campaign

Santa Clara's Annual Cleanup Campaign will take place **May 2 to May 27**. On designated weekends, **eligible** residences may set out bulky items that are not routinely collected by weekly solid waste services. Collection crews will be picking up furniture, appliances, e-waste, tires, residential construction debris and yard waste. All concrete, asphalt, dirt, brick, rocks, drywall and/or sawdust **MUST** be set out in a construction debris bulk bag to prevent it from entering the storm drains. Acceptable bags are made of heavy-duty tarp or plastic material made specifically for construction debris and can be no larger than one cubic yard in size. Debris bulk bags can be purchased at a retailer of your choice or at the Municipal Utility Services counter located at 1500 Warburton Ave for \$22.26 each starting **Monday, April 4**. Due to modified hours of operation, visit <u>SantaClaraCA.gov/AccessSantaClara</u> for the most up-to-date counter hours. Failure to use debris bags to contain residential construction/demolition debris is subject to a \$150 fine. A total of one cubic yard of bagged debris will be picked up at no charge. Any additional bagged material will be collected for a fee of \$25 per cubic yard. Household hazardous material is not accepted. To see if you are an eligible residence, set-out instructions and a list of accepted and prohibited materials, visit <u>SantaClaraCA.gov/Cleanup</u>. Questions?
