

Housing Element Update (2023-2031)

The City of Santa Clara is updating the City's Housing Element, a set of goals and policies that guide long-term decision-making on the development and maintenance of housing in the City of Santa Clara. State Law requires Santa Clara's General Plan Housing Element to accommodate the potential development of 11,632 housing units at various income levels over the next 8 years. Public input is a critical part of the Housing Element update process; your thoughts are important and will help the City set priorities for housing. Have your children considered studying abroad? There is an event on Tuesday, June 7, from 1-2:30 PM at the SES Hall, 1575 Lafayette Street, Santa Clara, where 12 universities from Portugal will have representatives onsite to talk about the different programs offered and what



is necessary to study abroad. Portugal has some of the oldest universities in the world. This event is open to all students and their families in the Bay Area. Light refreshments will be served. The San Francisco Consul General of Portugal will be in attendance too.

There is a lot of activity in Santa Clara related to housing. It was a pleasure to attend the Grand Opening of Calabazas Creek Apartments which provides housing for the homeless. I met with some of the residents and was touched by their stories but moreso their resilience and hope for the future. I also attended the groundbreaking for the Kifer Senior Apartments which will be built right next door to the Calabazas Creek Apartments. The City is thankful for the partnerships with the County of Santa Clara, Abode Services, Cisco, Capital One, Housing Trust Silicon Valley and the Santa Clara County Housing Authority for making this invaluable housing possible. On May 18, I represented the City of Santa Clara at the groundbreaking for the new Digested Sludge Dewatering Project located off of Zanker and Highway 237 near the San Jose-Santa Clara Regional Wastewater Facility. The City of Santa Clara is a 20% stakeholder



in this important facility that treats water that goes into the San Francisco Bay. When finished, this project will be used to free up 750 acres of land that would otherwise be used as drying beds for sludge. One of the benefits is that it will reduce odor impacts from the facility on the community.

District 1 is the most culturally diverse district in the City of Santa Clara. It is always an honor to participate in events that promote the diversity and heritage of our community. Such was the case on May 20 when Dharmic Organizations of the United States presented Darshana, a Glimpse Into The Hindu Civilization at City Hall

and the Northside Library. This exhibition presents a wonderful view of the Hindu culture and

With many of us going back to work and traveling for work, we are bringing laptops, phones and other valuable equipment back and forth from home to office and leaving them in our cars. Lately, there is an increase in car break-ins all over the Bay Area. Some areas like Mercado Shopping

Center, Rivermark Plaza and Mission



Park Marketplace (Montague and Mission College Boulevard) are popular targets for thieves. Although there are signs posted warning folks not to leave valuables in cars, people are in a hurry and think they won't be leaving their car for long. All it takes is 90 seconds - the time it takes for you to park your car and get your mobile ordered coffee - for a thief to quickly break into your car, grab your purse or backpack and they are gone. Please be diligent and do not leave valuables of any kind in your car. Laptops, iPads and iPhones when they are live are easily detected through gadgets



thieves use to pinpoint them and break into your car.

Free COVID-19 Testing & Get Vaccinated

In partnership with the County of Santa Clara, the City hosts free COVID-19 testing at Central Park Library, 2635 Homestead Ave. Upcoming testing dates include: June 8 (Testing on June 8 will take place at the Community Recreation Center (CRC) at 969 Kiely Blvd.) and June 22 from 9:30 a.m. to 3 p.m. Typically, 3-7 days before the testing date, schedule an appointment online. Climate Action Plan Adoption

Following over two years of community engagement, the City has developed a Draft Climate Action Plan (CAP) to update the current CAP adopted in 2013. Adoption of the CAP Update would extend the City's Greenhouse Gas (GHG) emissions reduction goals through 2030, address new State requirements established since the 2013 CAP was adopted, and offer a Qualified CAP that would provide California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) streamlining benefits. The City Council Adoption Hearing is scheduled for Tuesday, June 7, 2022.


Golden Eagle Exercise

In support of the 2022 Golden Eagle Exercise, the City of Santa **Clara Emergency Operations** Golden Eagle Exercise Center hosted the Bay Area Urban Area Security Initiative's Simulation Cell on May 19, 2022. The Golden Eagle Exercise is an annual regional disaster preparedness




exercise. This year, Santa Clara County's focus was on critical wildfire operations as one of the cascading effects of an earthquake. The Simulation Cell helps drive exercise play by providing exercise participants throughout the Bay Area with situational awareness they need to practice responding to incidents that could realistically occur in a real emergency.

Household Battery Collection



Household batteries contain toxic materials and should never be placed in curbside collection carts or bins. If not properly disposed of, old batteries can pose a threat to the environment. Drop off your used household batteries for recycling at any of the following City facilities during open business hours: City Hall Municipal Service Counter, all Santa Clara libraries, Senior Center and Community Recreation Center. Batteries accepted include alkaline button cell, AA, AAA, C, D, 9V and lithium-ion. For safety purposes please tape the ends of the battery terminals before placing into the battery recycling receptables. Call If You Can. Text If You Can't

Text to 9-1-1 provides another layer of service that has greatly enhanced public safety. It should be used in situations when you cannot safely and effectively call 9-1-1, such as:

- Caller with a hearing and/or speech impairment in need of emergency assistance
- In a situation where it is not safe to place a phone call (e.g. home ٠ intruder, domestic violence, etc.)
- Medical issue where you are unable to speak

In 2021, Public Safety Dispatcher's received 196 texts for police, fire, and medical related emergencies. Despite text messaging being one of the primary ways that people communicate today, dialing 9-1-1 in an emergency is still the preferred way to request police, fire, or medical assistance. Remember, "Call if you can, text if you can't."

Electrify Your Drive



Silicon Valley Power offers <u>rebates</u> up to \$1,500 for income-qualified customers to purchase a new or used electric vehicle (EV) or plug-in hybrid electric vehicles (PHEV). Customers installing an EV charging station may be eligible for a rebate up to \$550. If you require an electric panel upgrade when

installing the EV charging station, add a circuit for an electric heat pump water heater to make your home "electrification ready", and you may be eligible for a rebate on the electric panel upgrade as well! Electric panel upgrade incentives rage from \$1,000 - \$3,000. For more information on these programs, visit <u>SiliconValleyPower.com/Rebates</u>. There is a variety of incentive and assistance programs available, as well as federal tax credits, making the upfront cost of an EV more affordable than you may think!
