Silicon Valley Power Sustainable Futures Program to Support Future Leaders in Clean Energy

On June 7, 2021, the Santa Clara City Council unanimously approved the new Silicon Valley Power Sustainable Futures Program, which will provide scholarships and fellowships to up to 35 future leaders in sustainability, clean energy and related fields. The goal of the program is to develop a pipeline of strong, diverse future leaders in sustainability and clean energy sectors. The innovative, five-year program is funded by a \$375,000 grant from Silicon Valley Power, the City of Santa Clara’s not-for-profit municipal electric utility. Selected students - especially those transferring from local community colleges - will use the funds to attend and receive advanced opportunities at Santa Clara University and its award-winning environmental and sustainability curriculum. City of Santa Clara's Business Tax and License Webpage Upgrade

City of Santa Clara's Business Tax and License website portal is being upgraded! In addition to making your online payment by credit card, customers will also have the option to pay their business license fees via e-check, an online version of a handwritten check.

2022 Annual Street Maintenance and Rehabilitation Project

Construction will begin in July on the 2022 Annual Street Maintenance and Rehabilitation Project by the City's contractor O'Grady Paving, Inc. The project consists of removal and replacement of failed pavement areas, construction of new ADA-compliant curb ramps, installation of asphalt or application of slurry seal surface treatments, and replacement of pavement markings. This work will take place throughout the City. Replacement of failed pavement areas will begin in early July and will continue through October, with final project completion anticipated in late 2022. Some major streets to receive slurry seal and/or new asphalt paving include Lafayette Street, Mission College Boulevard, Great America Way, Di Giulio Avenue, Ronald Avenue, The Alameda, Memorex Drive, Avila Avenue, Norman Avenue, Dunford Way, and Scott Boulevard. Lafayette Street Crosswalk Removal

In conjunction with the City's 2022 Annual Street Maintenance and Rehabilitation Project, the City plans to remove eight existing crosswalks at seven intersections along Lafayette Street. These crosswalks do not provide a connection between existing sidewalks as there is no existing sidewalk along the west side of Lafayette Street and parking is not allowed. Furthermore, the Union Pacific Railroad tracks block any connection from Lafayette Street to Bassett Street at these locations. The intersections affected are Lafayette Street at Aldo Avenue, Clyde Avenue, Eisenhower Drive, Hogan Drive, Laurie



Safety Precautions for Planting or Trimming Trees Near Power Lines

Trees are an important part of our landscape and our environment, but they can grow into and around power lines, causing power outages. With proper care from property owners, we can minimize the risk of power outages and safety hazards. If planting a new tree, be sure to call **8-1-1 before you dig** to have any underground utilities located. The service is free and will help you avoid digging into underground utilities, which could be hazardous and costly. Avoid planting new trees near or under power lines. If an existing tree has grown into the power lines, don't attempt to trim it yourself. Contact Silicon Valley Power at 408-615-5640 to have a high voltage tree trimmer remove the branches from the power lines so that the property owner can continue to prune and maintain the tree safely. Shared Mobility Update (Bicycle and Scooter Share)

On December 7, 2021, the City Council approved the City's Shared Mobility Program (Program), which allows private operators to deploy shared mobility devices (bicycles and scooters) in Santa Clara. The City has selected two operators, Bird and Veo, to begin operation in Santa Clara this summer. The operators plan to provide up to 2,000 devices total with a mix of bicycles and scooters. Special Needs Awareness Program

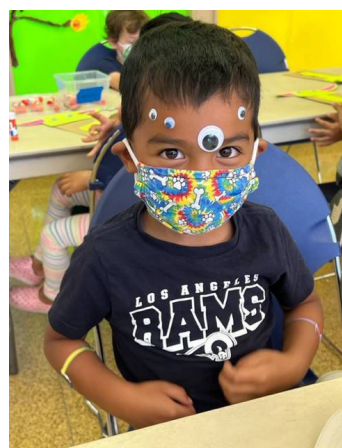

Candidates for the SNAP program include those with any of the following relevant medical conditions/behaviors: Speech impaired, visually impaired, hearing impaired, non-verbal, mood disorder, cognitive impairment, cerebral palsy, down syndrome, Parkinson's disease, Alzheimer's/dementia, Autism, Asperger's. Career Online High School

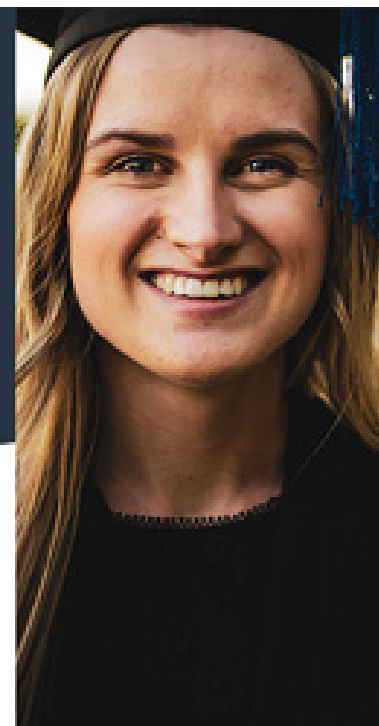
