

Outreach Priorities Jamboard




Outreach Jam Board

- Help unhoused people get connected to the Coordinated Entry System that will be used to fill new supportive housing units in Santa Clara
- Provide basic needs resources and information
- Provide basic needs to unhoused people in a consistent way and provide them dignity.
- Get chronically homeless people housed for the long term.

What We Can Expect From Shelter and Transitional Housing

It Will:

- Give people a place to sleep inside
- Address unmet basic or healthrelated needs
- Serve as
 an access point
 into
 the Coordinated
 Entry System

It Might:


- Provide case management and/or other supportive services
- Provide Problem
 Solving assistance to find a place to stay
- Support people toward independence and housing stability

It Won't:


- Prevent people from being unhoused in the first place
- Increase the supply of supportive or affordable housing
- End homelessness, on it's own, for most people


Questions for Panelists

Community Engagement Updates



Community Member Feedback

- Concerns about people living outside who may be hesitant to accept services or refuse services was a common theme
- It's important for programs to be in high opportunity areas, where residents can access jobs, public transit, and high-quality education for their children and themselves
- Barriers and rules can make it so that a person that is unhoused may not accept help

Service Provider Feedback

Need more affordable housing!

City of Santa Clara-specific outreach team Having services within the City is important

Providers aren't always sure of what services exist in the City

Seeing an increasingly older population

Language barriers



Feedback from People with Lived Experience of Homelessness

- Lack of access to transportation
- Lack of affordable child care
- Need more affordable housing
- Many folks are working full-time and still do not make enough money to pay for rent, medical care, or gas.
- Benefits program eligibility requirements don't reflect reality of the challenges people are facing.
- Mental health issues make it more difficult to access services
- People should not have to hit rock bottom or end up on the streets before they are able to get help.




