Let me share two stories as I ask for your vote.

A Threat – In 2016, 49er CEO Jed York visited my office saying he could lower the team's stadium rent. That would have been financial ruin for Santa Clara. I know how other cities, like Oakland, suffer from bad sports deals. For Santa Clara's sake, I said "no."

The team sued Santa Clara. We won. Instead of \$140 million less rent, we received an additional \$12 million, including attorney's fees. I'll always side with residents even in the face of threats from a \$5.2 billion team.

A Challenge – In 2020, there was no playbook for a global pandemic. I led Santa Clara to support our businesses and residents, especially our most vulnerable. We gave grants to small businesses, lowered utility rates, provided food to seniors and schoolchildren. We could help because I led efforts to be fiscally responsible. Our reserves increased by \$50 million during my first four mayoral years.
