Free Disposal Day

Santa Clara's next Free Disposal Day will be held on Sunday, Sept. 18, 6 a.m. - 12 p.m. at the Mission Trail Waste Systems (MTWS) Transfer Station. Residents will have an opportunity to dispose of appliances and e-waste items, as well as mattresses, furniture, and other bulky items. Appointments are required. Hazardous waste (e.g. paints, fluorescent bulbs, chemical cleaners, and pesticides, etc.), automotive parts, pressure treated wood and putrescible waste are prohibited. Call MTWS at 408-727-5365 between Sept. 5 - 16 to make an appointment and for location, load size limits and accepted materials. Proof of residency is required. Free Disposal Day is subject to all California Department of Public Health and Santa Clara County Public Health orders and guidelines. Should such guidelines or orders change, the event shall be modified to remain in compliance.

Household Hazardous Waste Drop-off Event

Santa Clara residents can safely dispose of household hazardous waste at the free dropoff event on Saturday, Sept. 24. Residents must register to attend by calling the County at 408-299-7300 or visiting hhw.org. Accepted hazardous items include fluorescent light tubes, compact fluorescent lightbulbs, paint, automotive fluids, cleaners, solvents, batteries, propane and helium tanks, fertilizers, pesticides, wood preservatives, sharps containers, prescription medications, and electronic waste (e-waste), among other things. Items NOT accepted include cardboard, Styrofoam, large household appliances, ammunition, explosives, or containers larger than five gallons. Contact the Police Department at 408-615-4700 regarding the disposal of ammunition or explosives.



Residential Compost Giveaway

Prepare those autumn and winter gardens with nutrient-rich compost. The City of Santa Clara is hosting a self-service compost giveaway event for Santa Clara residents on Sunday Sept. 25, 9 a.m. - Noon at the City's Corporation Yard, located at 1700 Walsh Ave. Residents must provide a current utility bill and/ or personal identification to verify eligibility. Compost will be self-served - residents must bring their own shovel and sturdy container (i.e. 5-gallon bucket), fill their container, and load their container into their vehicle. Maximum of 40 gallons per household. Compost will be available while supplies last and quantity is limited. Questions? 

Bicycle and Scooter Share

On Dec. 7, 2021, City Council approved the Shared Mobility Program (Program), which allows private operators to deploy shared mobility devices (bicycles and scooters) for use in Santa Clara. The City selected two operators, Bird and Veo, to begin operation in Santa Clara. The operators plan to provide up to 1,300 devices total with a mix of both bicycles and scooters.

On Aug. 8, 2022, Bird received their operating permit and officially launched and deployed 800 e-scooters and 200 e-bikes throughout the City. Devices are to be parked off the roadway and should provide adequate clearances as to not obstruct use of the sidewalk.

The City is working with Veo to finalize their operating permit to launch this Fall.

Additionally, staff added a MySantaClara App module for Bike/Scooter Share if residents or stakeholders would like to submit comments to the City. On Aug. 11, 2022, the Police Department released a <u>City News article</u> educating potential Shared Mobility users about basic operating rules for these devices.

Santa Clarans are on the right track with water conservation - let's keep it going! Visit Water & Sewer Utilities at City Hall (1500 Warburton Avenue) to pick up **free gear for conserving water**. Call ahead to (408) 615-2000 and let us know you are on the way. Indoor devices include low flow showerheads, toilet leak detection tablets, toilet flappers and kitchen or bathroom faucet aerators. For outdoor water savings, consider a free garden hose nozzle with automatic shut off, soil moisture meter to help determine watering needs or irrigation screwdriver to fine tune spray heads. Traditional methods of reaching SCPD should be utilized for any emergency or non-stadium, non-emergency situations. Please do not use social media to report issues requiring police, fire or medical response; it is not monitored regularly. Refer to the chart below for resources.

Community Engagement Meetings

The Police Department is interested in collaborating with residents to host Community Engagement Meetings (CEM), formerly known as Neighborhood Watch. This crime prevention

program enlists the participation of residents, in cooperation with law enforcement, to reduce crime in neighborhoods. CEM groups take a proactive approach to fighting crime by becoming

the extra set of eyes and ears for law enforcement. As we bring back this program, the Police Department also plans to invite the Mayor and Councilmember that represents your district so they can hear directly from you and your neighbors on law enforcement related issues. More \$\$ to Help You Conserve Water in the Landscape!

Santa Clara residents looking to replace their lawns are now eligible for \$4 per square foot (sf) for the first 1,000 sf and \$2/sf thereafter, up to \$5,000 with the Landscape Conversion Rebate. Residents can also take advantage of the Graywater Rebate for installing a Laundry to Landscape system, receiving up to \$400 plus permit costs per address. Increased rebate amounts went into effect September 1, 2022, thanks to Water & Sewer Utilities' increased cost sharing with Valley Water. \$25,000 Energy Efficiency Grants Available for Homeowner's Associations

Silicon Valley Power has launched a grant program to help Homeowner's Associations (HOAs) improve energy efficiency in common areas of their developments. Grants of up to \$25,000 are available to eligible HOAs located within the city of Santa Clara. A 20% copayment is required. Typical projects include upgrading hardwired lighting fixtures, such as exterior building lights, bollards, and parking lot lights, as well as interior fixtures in common areas such as clubhouses or recreational rooms. Grant awards will be made twice per year with deadlines on June 30 and December 31. For complete eligibility requirements and program details, visit SiliconValleyPower.com/Rebates.

Silicon Valley Power Offers \$2,000 Rebate to Upgrade to a Smart Electric Panel

To promote building and transportation electrification and reduce greenhouse gas emissions, Silicon Valley Power residential customers are now eligible for a rebate of \$2,000 when they upgrade their electric panel to a smart panel. Bonus incentives up to an additional \$2,000 are available to income-qualified customers. The rebate is available to customers to accommodate additional load from converting natural gas to electric appliances and adding a Level 2 EV charger to their home. A smart panel allows customers to monitor and control individual circuits and may include capabilities to provide notification when equipment is running abnormally and needs service. Smart panels can also help avoid electric service upgrades, which is a benefit to the customer. It is also a benefit to the utility, as transformers don't need to be upgraded. This program is available to customers who install a smart electric panel and qualifying appliance conversion or EV charger after July 1, 2022 and meet all program eligibility requirements. Senior Center Memberships Update

The Senior Center, located at 1303 Fremont St., provides a safe, positive, and welcoming environment. Programs and services are geared towards the adult community, ages 50 and up, for various abilities and life stages. The Senior Center offers a combination of Drop-in Programs, Senior Nutrition Program, Health & Wellness Program, Workshops and Trainings, a Fitness Center, Fitness Classes, Natatorium, Woodshop, Lapidary, Ceramics, and Special Interest Classes. The Senior Center is committed to providing low-cost programs that help maintain or increase health & wellness, reduce isolation, and provide referrals to resources.

In April 2022, Council reviewed and adopted a Parks & Recreation Cost Recovery Policy. It provides a framework for understanding the cost of services, the level of individual or community benefit, how much program participants might pay and how much City subsidy could be expected. The policy helps inform the City budget and program pricing decisions since the City faces both immediate and longer-term fiscal challenges where program expenses surpass City revenue. The Parks & Recreation Department has created two (2) membership levels for participation at the Senior Center: (a) Basic and (b) Premium.

Beginning Monday, Oct. 3, 2022, Senior Center memberships will have a nominal annual fee. These memberships include access to programs and facilities. Patrons may choose their membership level based on interest and a partial grant is available for those who may need financial assistance. Membership Fees and the General Fund subsidy support the facilities, programs, and services offered.

Memberships will be renewed when a patron's membership expires (i.e., if your membership expires in January you will need to renew and pay the fee at that time). Scholarships will be made available for those who qualify. Current Senior Card benefits are valid through the expiration date.
