As we move into the new year, it is with sincere appreciation that I acknowledge our City's achievements in 2022. This past year saw us emerging once again as a City, expanding public facility hours, holding in-person events, and reconnecting with that Santa Clara spirit which makes our diverse and vibrant community so special. Inperson staffing increased and City Hall expanded staffing and open hours to Monday through Friday. I want to recognize the tremendous efforts of City staff who continue to strive for excellence, providing vital City services and community programs as Santa Clara looks to the future.

Community is Everything

It is through our community gatherings and special events where Santa Clara truly shines. As more in-person events resumed in 2022, Santa Clarans rejoiced at events like Street Dance, Concerts in the Park, and the Art and Wine Festival which drew approximately 30K friends, families and visitors. Whether you caught a movie in the park during our Sunset Cinema series, hosted our first responders for National Night Out, or attended the annual 4th of July All-City

Picnic, I'd like to thank you for your continued commitment and dedication to our great City.

A Fiscal Path Forward

2022 brought more fiscal challenges as we continue to address the loss of tax revenues due to COVID-19, which has placed the City with an estimated \$27 million budget deficit. With our focus firmly on maintaining essential City services, the City Council and staff have made great efforts to address the shortfall through a combination of reserves, revenue solutions, and expenditure reductions. Though finances remain tight, I have optimism Santa Clara will remain on solid fiscal footing and manage the budget resourcefully.

A Resilient Santa Clara

While the pandemic has given us much to address financially, Santa Clara has nonetheless persevered, as demonstrated by new initiatives, awards and accomplishments:

The City convened a Homelessness Taskforce to help identify priorities, provide recommendations. and ultimately develop a plan to address homelessness in Santa Clara.

- · As we endure a second year of severe drought, the City began a robust community outreach plan to promote its Residential **Landscape Conversion** Rebate program, which was met with a huge response from residents, who have begun replacing their lawns with vibrant drought-tolerant landscaping.
- The Reed and Grant Sports Park - Santa Clara's new lighted, state-of-the-art, ecofriendly soccer facility - was awarded the 2021 American **Public Works Association** Project of the Year.
- · The City of Cupertino and the City of Santa Clara were awarded nearly \$8.5 million in State grant funding by the California State Transportation Agency to expand the Via-Cupertino On-Demand Shuttle service into Santa Clara using a fleet of zero-emission vehicles, allowing greater mobility for Santa Clarans who need it
- The Valley Transportation Authority (VTA) indicated that over \$17 million worth of transportation project grant

- applications submitted by Santa Clara were advancing through the selection process.
- Santa Clara's Levi's Stadium was chosen as one of the venues to host the 2026 FIFA World Cup, the world's preeminent international soccer tournament.

Looking to the Future

Santa Clara has endured many changes and challenges over its long history, and today is no exception. Throughout the pandemic, Santa Clarans proved their commitment to community through volunteerism, selfless charity, and guided by the simple principle that we are all so much stronger when we work together. As we look to the future, we take comfort in knowing the deep roots of our Santa Clara community remain the bedrock of our continued success. On



City Budget of Santa Clara

In June 2022, the City of Santa Clara adopted the biennial capital budget for the two-year period, July 1, 2022, through June 30, 2024, totaling \$355.9 million in FY 2022/23 and \$232.0 million in FY 2023/24. The Five-Year Capital Improvement Program totals \$830.3 million. This budget supports capital improvements throughout the City, including the utility infrastructure, parks, trails, libraries, transportation system, storm system, convention center and other city facilities. 2022/23 operating budget, which totals \$1.2 billion. This budget, which funds all City services and activities, is supported by a variety of revenues, such as user fees, property and sales tax, revenue from other agencies, licenses and permits, and other sources. The FY 2022/23 General Fund balancing strategy that was adopted in the FY 2021/22 and FY 2022/23 Biennial Operating Budget remains in place and primarily uses reserves to balance the budget. Although they are both important sources of revenue, only a small portion of property tax and sales tax goes to the City of Santa Clara.

- The City of Santa Clara receives \$10.19 of every \$100 collected in property tax.





Annual Cleanup Campaign is May 1 - May 26, 2023

The Cleanup Campaign is a service for the residents of the City of Santa Clara, not for people from other communities, contractors or businesses. Call 408-615-3080 weekdays or 408-615-5580 after 4:30 p.m. or on weekends to report illegal dumping in progress.

DO NOT set out your materials before the specified dates. Early set-outs are subject to a \$150 fine.

DO NOT block driveways, sidewalks or bike lanes.

Place materials only in front of your address and at least 3 feet from any obstructions such as fire hydrants, fences, poles, cars, trees, bushes or walls. Avoid parking on the street during your collection week.

Not all developments participate in the Cleanup Campaign. Check map to confirm correct set out times. Unsure about your area or where to place your items? Contact 408-615-3080.

ACCEPTED MATERIALS

- Bulky items such as old furniture, carpets, mattresses, toilets, foam
- Appliances, tires, e-waste (anything that requires a plug or battery to operate), untreated lumber, branches and brush (no longer than 6 feet in length). Separate each of these types of materials for special collection.
- All concrete, asphalt, dirt, brick, rocks, drywall and/or sawdust MUST be set out in a heavy duty bulk bag no larger than 1 cubic yard to prevent potential stormwater runoff pollution. Failure to use a bulk bag for these items is subject to a \$150 fine. Bulk bags may be purchased at a retailer of your choice or through Utility Services starting April 4. Contact Utility Services at 408-615-2300 to purchase and for pickup information. A total of 1 cubic yard of bagged debris will be picked up at no charge. Additional bagged cubic yards will be assessed at \$25/cubic yard.


ITEMS NOT ACCEPTED

- Pressure treated wood waste such as fence posts, railroad ties and decking must be managed as hazardous waste and will not be collected.
- **Contractor-generated** landscape or construction/demolition debris.
- Household hazardous waste such as paint, chemicals, automotive fluids, solvents, fertilizers, cleaning products, compact fluorescent light bulbs (CFLs), batteries or sharps. Illegal set-out of hazardous materials is subject to a \$500 fine.

- **Biohazardous waste** or biomedical waste such as diapers, sanitary napkins. sharps and syringes, human and animal waste, and any other infectious
- Ammunition and explosives. For safe disposal, call the Santa Clara Police Department at 408-615-5580.
- Medications. Safely dispose of expired or unwanted medications at the MED-Project kiosks located throughout the City. For additional information and a list of locations, visit **SCCMEDS.org**.
