

2023 Charter Review Committee

At its June 6, 2023 meeting, the Council directed the creation of a 2023 Charter Review Committee (4-3 vote) to review and recommend to the City Council whether the provisions in the City Charter that provide for an elected Police Chief and/or

City Clerk shall remain the same or whether an amendment to change the positions from elected to appointed positions and/or other changes to be placed on the March 2024 ballot. Each Councilmember is to nominate one individual from his/her district with the Mayor to nominate one individual at large. The deadline to submit names of nominees is Noon on July 12. It is anticipated that the first meeting of the Committee will take place in early August.

Fiscal Year 2023-2024 Budget Adoption

On June 27, the Santa Clara City Council reviewed and approved the FY 2023/24 and FY 2024/25 Biennial Operating Budget and amendments to the FY 2023/24 Adopted Capital Budget. This budget continues the biennial budget process that alternates between an operating and capital budget each year. The Adopted Budget focuses on the day-to-day City operations and the services provided to our residents and community.

Over the past year, the City has emerged from the impacts of the pandemic and continues to strengthen the City's financial position. This budget stabilizes the City services that residents access on a regular basis as the City continues to recover from the pandemic service disruptions. The City continues to recruit and fill vacant positions to continue the commitment to provide exceptional services to our residents, businesses and community.

Creek Trail Network Expansion Master Plan

The City is currently developing a master plan for the development of public trail corridors along Calabazas Creek, Saratoga Creek, and the Hetch Hetchy right-of-way. This masterplan builds upon the efforts of the 2013 City of Santa Clara Creek Trail Network Expansion Feasibility Study. The goal of the master plan is to coordinate with public agencies, private landowners, residents, and future trail users to develop conceptual trail options that help serve the entire community. Recycled Water: Driving Santa Clara Forward!

Pruneridge Golf Club's driving range has transitioned to recycled water irrigation of over 175,000 square feet of turf within the netted training ground! The milestone recycled water project reduces strain on local potable water systems without any interruption to the club's avid golfers. This was the result of strategic planning and partnership with Pruneridge Golf Club staff and Santa Clara Water & Sewer Utilities to bring recycled water to the site. This is just the first step towards the ultimate goal of irrigating the entire golf course using recycled water throughout the greens and grounds. Connections are in place and ready to make that goal a reality!

Park Rehabilitation Projects

The Parks & Recreation Commission will initiate a public input process to assist in rehabilitating:

- Henry Schmidt Park (built in 1977) located at 555 Los Padres Blvd. with a focus on the playground, pathways, tennis courts and accessibility.
- Warburton Park & Pool (built in 1954) located at 2250 Royal Dr. with a focus on the playground, basketball court & picnic area plus study pool conversion from gas to electric.

Outreach and online survey information will be available at the July Parks & Recreation Commission Meeting.

Bikeway Planning Studies

In January 2023, the City kicked off four bikeway planning studies for implementing new bikeway facilities along multiple corridors in Santa Clara. The studies are being funded with the support of Valley Transportation Authority's (VTA) Measure B Program and contributions from private development. The new bikeway facilities are based on recommendations from the City of Santa Clara Bicycle Plan and may include lane reductions and/or parking removal. The study corridors are grouped by geographic location and include:

Recycled Water Irrigation

Currently, the project teams are evaluating traffic and parking data, collision history and community feedback to develop draft conceptual plans showing options for the installation of the preferred bikeway facility. the year. Shipping is free for orders of \$50 or more and just \$5 for all other orders. Visit <u>PoweredByEFI.org/SVP</u> to sign up for an account using your Silicon Valley Power utility account number to take advantage of the instant rebates and special promotions.

Call If You Can. Text If You Can't!

Text to 9-1-1 provides another layer of service that has greatly enhanced public safety. It should be used in situations when you cannot safely and effectively call 9-1-1, such as:

- Caller with a hearing and/or speech impairment in need of emergency assistance
- In a situation where it is not safe to place a phone call (e.g. home intruder, domestic violence, etc.)
- Medical issue where you are unable to speak

In 2021, Public Safety Dispatcher's received 196 texts for police, fire and medical related emergencies. Despite text messaging being one of the primary ways that people communicate today, dialing 9-1-1 in an emergency is still the preferred way to request police, fire or medical assistance. Remember, "Call if you can, text if you can't."

One Year Milestone for 988 Crisis Lifeline

One year ago, a new universal three-digit number was implemented across the United States to improve our nation's response to mental health and suicide crises. To date, more than 4 million contacts have been routed to 988.

Call, text, or chat 988 to connect with trained counselors that are part of the National Suicide Prevention Lifeline network. The counselors will listen, provide support and connect contacts to resources if necessary. The 988 Lifeline is operational 24/7 and accepts calls, texts and chats from anyone who needs support for a suicidal, mental health and/or substance use crisis.

988 is intended to be an alternative to 9-1-1, however if the risk to someone's life cannot be reduced during a Lifeline call, a crisis counselor may contact a local public safety answer point for emergency first responder assistance. For additional information, visit <u>988lifeline.org</u>.


