

JW House 15 Year Anniversary - Triton Museum Garden Party



JW House located on the Kaiser Permanente Campus in Santa Clara celebrated 15 years of providing thousands of families hope, healing and comfort as their loved ones battle critical illnesses and seek medical treatment in Silicon Valley hospitals.

JW House began as the idea of Jan-Wilem (JW) Knapen, a boy who, in the midst of battling cancer, wanted to do something to help other children and families facing similar situations.

JW was diagnosed with leukemia at the age of four. Despite early hardships, he thrived and moved to San Jose from Belgium with his family. His mother Anne Marie, father Geert, and sisters Helena and Elisabeth were present at the Anniversary celebration.

While a freshman at Bellarmine College Preparatory, he suffered seizures and was later diagnosed with brain cancer. He developed a special friendship with his doctor, Alan Wong, and together they created the idea of the home. Fundraising started and this dream became a reality in 2008. JW passed in 2005 before the grand opening, however he knew that his friends and family were fully committed to making his dream a reality.

Many of our non-profit, fraternal organizations, high school students, and public safety foundations donate their time, goods and services to the JW House. \$5,000 Grants Available to High School Students for Energy Efficiency or Renewable Energy Projects

Silicon Valley Power offers grants up to \$5,000 for high school students to create projects or awareness campaigns that will educate the Santa Clara community about energy efficiency and/ or renewable energy. Examples include but are not limited to educational videos, public art displays, online resources, outreach materials, demonstration projects, webinars, or workshops. Content must promote energy efficiency and/or renewable energy. The program is open to high school students who live in the City of Santa Clara or attend school at a site located within the Santa Clara city limits. Preference is given to projects that include components targeting diversity, equity and inclusion. Applications will be scored based on the content, key messages, target audience, community reach and value for the money spent. There are several ways to reach the Santa Clara Police Department depending on the situation.



Changes under consideration include but are not limited to: 1) a review of qualifications and eligibility requirements for the two elected positions; 2) converting the positions from elected to appointed; and 3) if appointed, discussion of the appropriate appointing authority for the positions.



Stevens Creek Boulevard Vision Study Update

The cities of Santa Clara, San Jose, Cupertino, the County of Santa Clara and the Santa Clara Valley Transportation Authority (VTA) are conducting an approximately two-year, community-based transportation study for the Stevens Creek Boulevard/West San Carlos corridor. The goal is to create a vision that focuses on complete streets, multi-modal transportation improvements, and possible high-capacity transit options to connect Diridon Station in San Jose through Santa Clara to the De Anza College/Highway 85 area in Cupertino.

It should be noted that this is only at a planning level and does not include design, environmental review, or construction of any improvements. At the completion of the work effort, if the jurisdictions decide to move forward with specific plans or improvements, then additional funds would be required to for design, bid and construction.



On September 2, citizen scientists gathered at Everett N. "Eddie" Souza Park, 2380 Monroe Street, to participate in the annual Parks 4 Pollinators Bioblitz. The goal was to capture photo evidence of pollinators and wildlife and gather information about the biodiversity of our city parks and how to protect them for the future. Using the iNaturalist App, participants were able to identify 44 species of flora and fauna. Expert biologist of Bioblitz. club, Merav Vonshank, provided guidance on how to find the insects and the function they provide to our ecosystem. Blood Pressure Clinic - Drop In

Stop by on Wednesdays from 10:30 a.m. – 12 p.m. for a free blood pressure screening. Health & Wellness Program nurses provide screenings on a first-come, first-served basis. Take a number at the door and then rest a few minutes prior to your screening. High blood pressure adds to the workload of your heart. If left untreated, over time your heart, kidneys, eyes, and brain may all be affected. Learn your numbers and do regular checks to make sure your heart is tip-top.

Student Nurses Available for Home Visits!

Every year, the Senior Center's Health & Wellness Program partners with the University of San Francisco School of Nursing. These student nurses are smart and engaging, and they are here for their Community Health and Psychology rotations. Part of that experience is providing supervised, friendly-visitor and wellness check home visits. They can measure your blood pressure, provide health information, assist you in connecting with resources, or just enjoy a friendly chat. This is also a chance to help a young adult understand what it's like to be you. Students are accompanied by Mallory von Kugelgen, RN, Health & Wellness Coordinator, and under the supervision of their nursing professor.
