## Presidential Volunteer Service Award

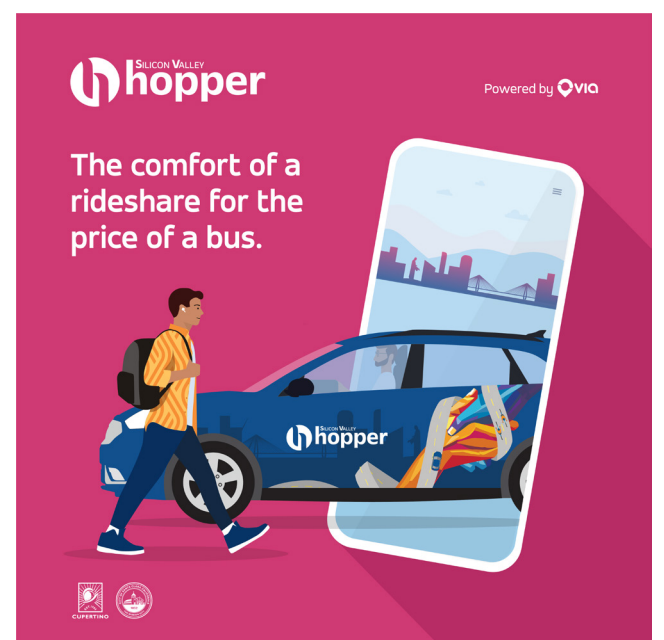

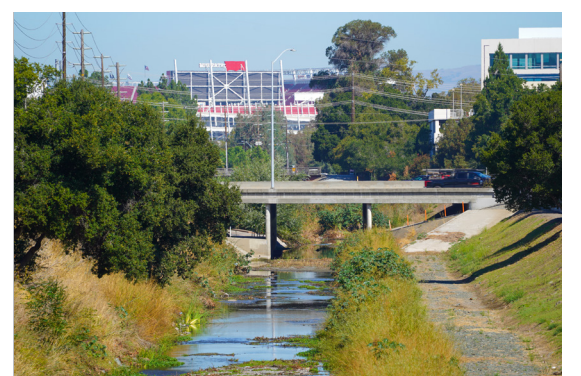
## Silicon Valley Power Recognized as Smart Energy Provider

## A Message From Your Garden

“Stop watering me!” Once the cool season starts, most established landscapes don’t require supplemental irrigation. If you find your garden needs watering, be mindful of the City’s Water Use Restrictions and Prohibitions:

### **DO NOT**

- X** Water lawns during or within 48 hours of measurable rainfall
- X** Run irrigation between the hours of 9 a.m. and 6 p.m.
- X** Allow water to runoff onto sidewalks or other paved surfaces

If you see a violation of the water use prohibitions, report [water waste](#) via one of these methods:

- Complete an online [Water Waste Report](#)
- Submit a request via the MySantaClara mobile app
- Call the Water Department at 408-615-2000 during regular business hours

All state and countywide reports are received by Santa Clara staff for investigation.

## **\$5,000 Grants Available to High School Students for Energy Efficiency or Renewable Energy Projects**

Silicon Valley Power offers grants up to \$5,000 for high school students to create projects or awareness campaigns to educate the Santa Clara community about energy efficiency and/or renewable energy. Examples include but are not limited to educational videos, public art displays, online resources, outreach materials, demonstration projects, webinars, or workshops. Content must promote energy efficiency and/or renewable energy.

The program is open to high school students who live in the City of Santa Clara or attend school at a site located within the Santa Clara city limits. Preference is given to projects that include components targeting diversity, equity and inclusion. Applications will be scored based on the content, key messages, target audience, community reach and value for the money spent.

Grant awards will be made twice per year with deadlines on Jun. 30 and Dec. 31. For complete eligibility requirements and program details, visit [SiliconValleyPower.com/Grants](https://SiliconValleyPower.com/Grants).

## **\$100,000 Grants Available for Nonprofits to Install Solar Energy Systems**

Silicon Valley Power has launched a program offering grants up to \$100,000 to qualifying nonprofit organizations for the installation of a solar photovoltaic (PV) system at facilities located in the city of Santa Clara. The program is intended to help nonprofit organizations offset up to 80% of their electric costs so those funds can be used on programs and services to support the Santa Clara community.

Grants may cover up to 100 percent of the system cost, and up to ten percent of the grant may be used on qualifying building repairs or infrastructure to make the site PV ready. Examples include roofing repairs or a ground mount structure to support PV panels.

Applications are pre-approved on a first come, first served basis until funds are exhausted. Customers will have six months from the date of pre-approval to install the PV system and receive the grant. 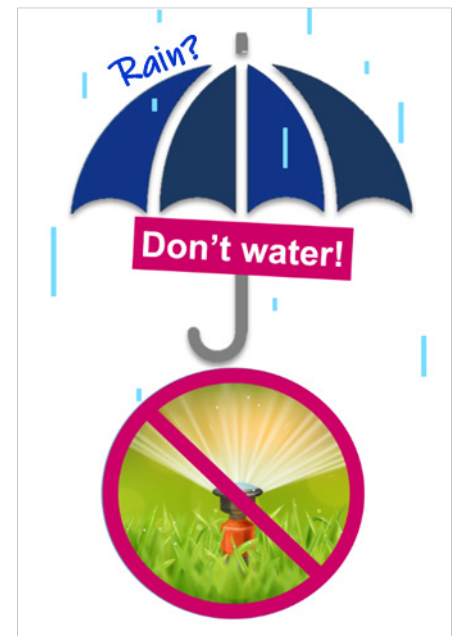
## **Shared Mobility Program Update**

The City of Santa Clara Shared Mobility Program is in the second year of operation. For FY 2023-24 the City has selected Bird and Lime to participate in the Program. In October, Lime obtained an operating permit to deploy up to 300 e-scooters in Santa Clara. Recently, Bird obtained an operating permit to deploy up to 150 e-scooters. In total, Santa Clara will have up to 450 e-scooters deployed throughout the City for public rental. The goal of the Program is to provide an alternative travel option for Santa Clara residents and visitors to access transit, shopping, and entertainment areas. 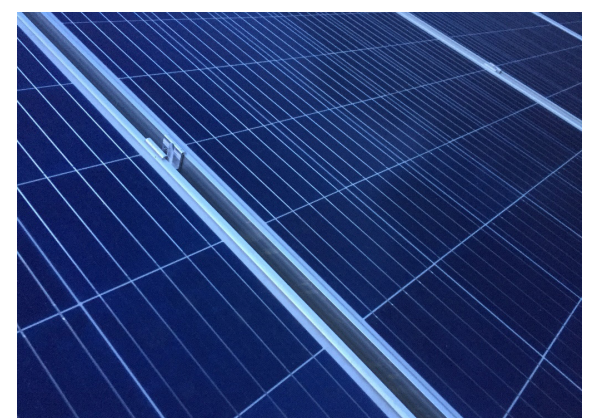
## **Holiday Solid Waste Collection**

There will be NO solid waste collection services on Monday, Dec. 25 or Monday, Jan. 1. Collection will occur one day later on these weeks.

Residents with garbage cart service may set out up to two additional 32-gallon garbage bags (maximum weight 30 pounds per bag) on each of their collection days Dec. 26 – Jan. 6 at no extra charge. Commercial and multi-family registered account holders with front load bin service may arrange for one additional pickup, per garbage account, per year, at no extra charge by contacting Mission Trail Waste Systems at 408-727-5365.

### **Recycle Your Holiday Tree**

Residential holiday trees will be collected curbside on regular garbage collection days during the week of Jan. 8 – 12. Remove all ornaments, tinsel, nails and the stand. After Jan. 12, cut up your tree and place the pieces in your green yard trimmings cart. Flocked trees should be cut up and placed in your garbage cart. ### **Remember Your Reusables!**

The holiday season is upon us and that means celebrating with family, friends, and food! Holiday gatherings create fun memories but can also create extra waste. Follow these tips for planning an eco-friendly celebration this holiday season.

1. Create a meal plan based on the number of people attending your celebration. Visit [SaveTheFood.com](http://SaveTheFood.com) to use the dinner party calculator to estimate how much food is needed based on the number of guests and the type of meal provided.
2. Check the pantry, refrigerator, and freezer to see if you already have items that you will need before grocery shopping for your planned feast. Doing so prevents overbuying and additional food waste.
3. Make a shopping list and only buy what is needed. Shopping with a list will keep you from overbuying and on budget!
4. Ditch the plastic utensils, cups, and paper napkins! Using reusable glass and cloth counterparts makes for a beautiful tablescape and keeps unnecessary items out of the landfill.
5. Encourage your guests to bring their own reusable containers for those yummy leftovers.

### **'Tis the Season for Car Break-ins and Package Thefts**

'Tis the season for holiday shopping. Unfortunately, it's also the time of year where criminals target quick, easy and low-risk crimes – such as car break-ins and package thefts.

Remove the attraction by taking valuables out of your car when you are not in it – at home, at work, when you are out to eat, at the gym and in a shopping center. This includes purses, laptops, cell phones, GPS systems, sunglasses and bags (e.g. laptop bags, shopping bags, gym bag, etc.). Anything visible to a passerby can be a theft magnet!

You are also encouraged to put practices in place to outsmart package thieves, such as:

- Order well ahead of the holiday
- Deliver to a work address, ship to a locker (available at some grocers and convenience stores) or obtain via retailer curbside pick-up
- If shipping to your home, use a post office box, request signature on delivery or install a secure mailbox for deliveries
- Create a concealed delivery spot at your residence and provide instructions about where packages should be left
- Request ordinary, nondescript packaging
- Insure valuable items
- Set up text or email notifications for up-to-date package tracking
- Retrieve the package as soon as it arrives - possibly, with assistance from a neighbor, family member or friend
- Consider installing a security camera(s) or video doorbell, and advertise that you have a security system

Residents are asked to stay vigilant! Report suspicious activity to the Police Department by calling the non-emergency phone line at 408-615-5580. Public Safety Dispatchers will want to know details of the suspicious activity, suspect(s) description, vehicle details and direction of travel. Should you happen to witness a crime, do not approach the suspect. Instead, be a good witness and dial 9-1-1 immediately.

### **Holiday Party / Drinking and Driving**

As the holidays approach, the Santa Clara Police Department (SCPD) is urging motorists to plan a safe ride home and never get behind the wheel drunk or under the influence of drugs. If you observe a drunk driver, call 9-1-1 immediately.

## Stevens Creek Boulevard Vision Study Update

The cities of Santa Clara, San Jose, Cupertino, the County of Santa Clara and the Santa Clara Valley Transportation Authority (VTA) are conducting an approximately two-year, community-based transportation study for the Stevens Creek Boulevard/West San Carlos corridor. The goal is to create a vision that focuses on complete streets, multi-modal transportation improvements, and possible high-capacity transit options to connect Diridon Station in San Jose through Santa Clara to the De Anza College/Highway 85 area in Cupertino. ## Free Disposal Day

Start the New Year off with less clutter around your home! Santa Clara's next Free Disposal Day will be held on **Saturday, Jan. 20 from 6 a.m. – noon**, at Mission Trail Waste Systems (MTWS) Transfer Station. Free Disposal Day provides residents an opportunity to dispose of appliances and e-waste items, as well as mattresses, furniture, and other bulky items at no cost. Appointments are required. Hazardous waste (e.g. paints, fluorescent bulbs, chemical cleaners, and pesticides, etc.), automotive parts, and pressure treated wood **are prohibited**. To participate in our "Free Disposal Day" call MTWS at 408-727-5365 between Jan. 8 - 19 to make an appointment and for details on location, load size limits and accepted/non-accepted materials. Proof of residency (utility bill or driver's license) is required. Residents are responsible for unloading their vehicles.

## Household Hazardous Waste Drop-off Event

Santa Clara residents can safely dispose of household hazardous waste (HHW) at the free HHW drop-off event that will take place on **Saturday, Jan. 27** in Santa Clara or any of the HHW events located countywide throughout the year. Residents **must** register to attend this event by calling the County Household Hazardous Waste Program at 408-299-7300 or by visiting [hww.org](http://hww.org). Items that can be disposed of include fluorescent light tubes, compact fluorescent lightbulbs, paint, automotive fluids, cleaners, solvents, batteries, propane and helium tanks, fertilizers, pesticides, wood preservatives, sharps containers, prescription medications, electronic waste (e-waste), and other types of household hazardous wastes. Items NOT accepted include Styrofoam, large household appliances, ammunition, explosives, or containers larger than five gallons.
