# Dear Community,

It has been an honor and a pleasure getting acquainted with you all since becoming your City Manager in May of 2023. Through my participation in community events like National Night Out and the Art & Wine Festival, I've been able to engage with Santa Clara residents and see firsthand how deeply you care about your city.

## **Looking Back at 2023**

2023 was a year of positive change as we moved past the lingering effects of the pandemic. City Hall and other public-facing facilities expanded in-person service hours to Monday-Friday, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., with additional expanded hours at our Community Recreation Center and Senior Center. Our City libraries increased their weekly operating hours by 64% to better serve our community, and we instituted a new policy to eliminate overdue fees to increase equity in access to public services.

As Santa Clara continues to grow, it is vital we meet the needs of our diverse community with new approaches to infrastructure, housing and amenities. Last year saw the grand opening of

Agrihood, the largest urban farm and affordable senior housing community in California, where we can expect over 50 community events each year. The City is also anxiously awaiting the completion of the Magical Bridge Playground in Central Park, which broke ground in May. This innovative all-inclusive playground promises to promote belonging, fitness and inspire the magic of play for residents of all ages and abilities.

The City is committed to an improved quality of life while creating a more Sustainable Santa Clara. This year we launched a series of Bikeway Planning Studies to improve the safety and efficiency of our roadways for bicycle and pedestrian traffic. In partnership with Silicon Valley Power (SVP), the City's vehicle maintenance team has led the way in transportation electrification. The City now has 44 electric vehicles (EV's) on fleet, and as part of SVP's Community Electric Vehicle Blueprint, 95 public EV charging stations have been installed so far.

Water savings was another key accomplishment in 2023. Santa Clara residents utilized the Landscape Conversion Rebate to convert 180,481 sq. ft. of lawns into drought tolerant landscaping, the second highest conversion rate among local cities served by Valley Water.

## **A Brighter Financial Picture**

Last year we worked to bring more stability to the City's fiscal outlook following the negative impacts of COVID-19. Through a combination of expenditure reductions, use of reserves, and improved revenue, the City was able to reduce its structural budget deficit from \$27 million down to \$9 million, and approve a balanced two-year budget. The voterapproved Business License Tax Update was rolled out in July, and combined with improved Transient Occupancy Tax revenue, and the voter-approved Utility Transfer Measure, essential City services will continue to be protected as the financial picture improves.

The City also embraced the enthusiasm around some of the hottest summer concerts sweeping through Levi's® Stadium. The City was renamed "Swiftie Clara" during Taylor Swift's two-night concert engagement, with the performer receiving the title

of honorary Mayor. Legendary performer Beyoncé was also given the ceremonial title of Mayor for the Day and awarded a key to the City. Efforts to engage with the energy of concertgoers has continued to establish Cityowned Levi's® Stadium as the preeminent entertainment venue in the region, driving much-needed revenue to local businesses.

## **Commitment to Service**

In closing, I would like to thank
City staff across all departments for
your dedicated professionalism and
commitment to service. We are all
enormously thankful for the work
you do to provide quality services to
residents and businesses. I would
also like to thank the Santa Clara
community for the warmest of
welcomes as I begin my tenure as
your City Manager. I am humbled
by your pride and dedication to
community and am excited by



what we will accomplish together in Santa Clara going forward.

# **City Budget of Santa Clara**

In June 2023, the City of Santa Clara adopted the biennial operating budget for the two-year period. July 1, 2023, through June 30. 2025, totaling \$1.62 billion in FY 2023/24 and \$1.37 billion in FY 2024/25. This budget, which funds all City services and activities, is supported by a variety of revenues, such as user fees, local property and sales tax, revenue from other agencies, licenses and permits, rent and interest on investments, and other sources.





# **Annual Cleanup Campaign is April 29-May 24, 2024**

The Cleanup Campaign is a service for the residents of the City of Santa Clara, not for people from other communities, contractors or businesses.

Call 408-615-3080 weekdays or 408-615-5580 after 4:30 p.m. or on weekends to report illegal dumping in progress.

**DO NOT** set out your materials before the specified dates. Early set-outs are subject to a **\$150** fine.

## DO NOT block driveways, sidewalks or bike lanes.

Place materials only in front of your address and at least 3 feet from any obstructions such as fire hydrants, fences, poles, cars, trees, bushes or walls.

Avoid parking on the street during your collection week.

Not all developments participate in the Cleanup Campaign. Check map to confirm correct set out times. Unsure about your area or where to place your items?

Contact 408-615-3080.

#### **ACCEPTED MATERIALS**

- Bulky items such as old furniture, carpets, mattresses, toilets, foam packaging, etc.
- Appliances, tires, e-waste (anything that requires a plug or battery to operate), untreated lumber, branches and brush (no longer than 6 feet in length). Separate each of these types of materials for special collection.
- All concrete, asphalt, dirt, brick, rocks, drywall and/or sawdust MUST be set out in a heavy duty bulk bag no larger than 1 cubic yard to prevent potential stormwater runoff pollution. Failure to use a bulk bag for these items is subject to a \$150 fine. Bulk bags may be purchased at a retailer of your choice or through Utility Services starting April 15. Contact Utility Services at 408-615-2300 to purchase and for pickup information. A total of 1 cubic yard of bagged debris will be picked up at no charge. Additional bagged cubic yards will be assessed at \$25/cubic yard.

#### **ITEMS NOT ACCEPTED**

- Pressure treated wood waste such as fence posts, railroad ties and decking must be managed as hazardous waste and will not be collected.
- Contractor-generated landscape or construction/demolition debris.
- Household hazardous waste such as paint, chemicals, automotive fluids, solvents, fertilizers, cleaning products, compact fluorescent light bulbs (CFLs), batteries or sharps. Illegal set-out of hazardous materials is subject to a \$500 fine.
- Visit **HHW.org** or call the County Household Hazardous Waste Program at 408-299-7300 to schedule a FREE drop-off appointment.
- Biohazardous waste or biomedical waste such as diapers, sanitary napkins, sharps and syringes, human and animal waste, and any other infectious materials.
- Ammunition and explosives. For safe disposal, call the Santa Clara Police Department at 408-615-5580.
- Medications. Safely dispose of expired or unwanted medications at the MED-Project kiosks located throughout the City. For additional information and a list of locations, visit SCCMEDS.org.

Do your part to make sure recyclable and salvageable materials stay out of the landfill. Visit **SantaClaraCA.gov/CleanSC** for a list of items accepted in your weekly curbside recycling collection.
