- popular culture/pop culture: (noun phrase) The trends, music, art, movies, and other forms of entertainment that are popular with the general public, especially young people.
- trends: (noun, plural) Current patterns or activities that are followed by many people, especially for a short period of time.
- dance craze: (noun phrase) A popular dance style or routine that is widely imitated for a short period, often associated with specific music or videos.
- app: (noun) A small computer program designed to run on a mobile device like a phone or tablet, typically focusing on a specific task or function.
- clash: (verb) To disagree or fight with someone, often about ideas or opinions.
- preferences: (noun, plural) Things that someone likes or chooses more than others.

- impact: (noun) The effect or influence that something has on people or events.
- values: (noun, plural) The principles or standards of behavior that are considered important or desirable by a person or group of people.
- communication: (noun) The exchange of information, ideas, or feelings between people through speech, writing, or other means.
