



Introducing Engine 91

Meet Santa Clara Fire Department's newest addition to the emergency response fleet - the new Engine 91, a Spartan Metro Star Type I Engine! The new fire engine has a 1500GPM (gallons per minute) pump, 500 gallon water tank, and a variety of firefighting hose lines. In addition, the new engine boasts a new paint scheme with a slightly darker shade of red and accompanying gray color stripes and accents. The Fire Dept was able to supplement the allocated engine replacement funding with wildland deployment reimbursements from the FY2021-22 wildland season. Keep your eyes out for Engine 91 which responds out of Fire Station #1 on 777 Benton Street!

Sufficient Rain? Not Yet...

It's the New Year! By contrast, our rainfall year now enters its seventh month. Late December and New Year rains slightly bolstered rainfall totals that barely passed half an inch as of Dec. 1, 2023 (22% of normal), but the State Water Project has allocated Valley Water just 10% of the water requested. Due to last winter's deluge, water storage levels remain healthy - for now. Groundwater wells within the City provide most of our drinking water supply. An additional fifth comes from the San Francisco Public Utilities Commission's (SFPUC) Hetch-Hetchy Reservoir. The remaining fifth is from Valley Water, heavily reliant on State Water Project allocations. We must again embrace the reality: *Rain or Shine, There is Never Enough to Waste*. Bikeway Planning Studies

In January 2024, the City will host the final round of virtual community meetings for four bikeway planning projects. The meetings will include a discussion of the proposed bikeway design alternatives and the effects the project will have on the study area (including traffic and parking data). The study corridors include:

- **De La Cruz Boulevard** (Central Expressway to Lafayette Street) and **Coleman Avenue** (De La Cruz Boulevard to Brokaw Road)
- Walsh Avenue (Bowers Avenue to Lafayette Street) and Martin Avenue (Lafayette Street to De La Cruz Boulevard)
- Monroe Street (Lawrence Expressway to San Tomas Expressway)
- Benton Street (Dunford Way to Lincoln Street)



A final online survey will be available in January 2024 to obtain community preferences for the bikeway design alternatives. For more information about the projects, how to provide feedback or attend future pubic meetings, visit <u>SantaClaraCA.gov/BikePedProjects</u>.

Rate Increase of 10% Effective January 1, 2024

On Dec. 5, 2023, the Santa Clara City Council approved a rate increase of 10% for all electric customers. This increase will take effect Jan. 1, 2024 and customers will see it reflected on utility bills received in February. The increase in rates is necessary to complete maintenance and operation of the electric system. It helps to cover the rising costs of producing, purchasing and transmitting power as well as equipment and material costs, which have increased by double and triple digits. Silicon Valley Power's (SVP) electricity rates remain among the lowest for California utilities serving more than 10,000 customers. Electric system improvements include replacing old power poles, crossarms and transformers to prevent outages and maintain high-quality service. The rate increase and system improvements will help ensure a reliable power system for Santa Clara in the future. SVP understands the impacts rising utility costs have on all its customers. The utility offers

a variety of programs to assist customers in reducing energy costs, including a <u>discount on utility rates for income-qualified</u> <u>customers</u> and a variety of rebate programs to help with the cost of new energy efficient appliances. Financial Rate Assistance Program Provides Discount Up to 40%

Silicon Valley Power understands the economic pressures on its customers due to inflation and rising energy costs. To help financially vulnerable customers, the utility offers a Financial Rate Assistance Program (FRAP) to provide a discount on the electric bill for all eligible customers. The program is tiered to provide the most help to customers who earn the least amount of money. Discounts range from 25-40%, depending on income eligibility. Free Disposal Day

Start the New Year off with less clutter around your home! Free Disposal Day will be held on **Saturday, Jan. 20 from 6 a.m. to noon** at Mission Trail Waste Systems (MTWS) Transfer Station. Dispose of appliances and e-waste items, as well as mattresses, furniture, and other bulky items at no cost. A limit of one (1) cubic yard of dirt, concrete, sod, brick, and/or rock will apply. Appointments required. Hazardous waste (e.g. paints, fluorescent bulbs, chemical cleaners, and pesticides, etc.), automotive parts, and pressure treated wood are prohibited. To participate in our "Free Disposal Day" call MTWS at 408-727-5365 between Jan. 8 - 19 to make an appointment and for details on location, load size limits and accepted/non-accepted materials. Proof of residency (utility bill or driver's license) is required. Residents are responsible for unloading their vehicles.

Household Hazardous Waste Drop-off Event

Santa Clara residents can safely dispose of household hazardous waste (HHW) at the free HHW drop-off event on **Saturday, Jan. 27** in Santa Clara or any of the HHW events located countywide throughout the year. Residents must register to attend this event by calling the County Household Hazardous Waste Program at 408-299-7300 or by visiting hhw.org. Items that can be disposed of include fluorescent light tubes, compact fluorescent lightbulbs, paint, automotive fluids, cleaners, solvents, batteries, propane and helium tanks, fertilizers, pesticides, wood preservatives, sharps containers, prescription medications, electronic waste (e-waste), and other types of household hazardous wastes. Items NOT accepted include Styrofoam, large household appliances, ammunition, explosives, or containers larger than five gallons. For more information on the types of household hazardous waste that are accepted, contact the County HHW Program. For the safe disposal of ammunition or explosives, contact the Police Department at 408-615-4700.


