


Message from Councilmember Kathy Watanabe

Meeting With Rivermark Plaza Management



Unveiling of Norm Mineta Statue at San Jose Mineta International Airport

On January 25, I had the honor of attending the unveiling of the Norm Mineta statue in San Jose Mineta International Airport that will now greet passengers in the Baggage Claim of Terminal B when they arrive in San Jose. Norm Mineta, who passed away on May 3, 2022, left an incredible legacy. He was from San Jose and was the first Asian-American elected Mayor of San Jose. He served in Congress for 20 years before becoming Secretary of Transportation under President George W. Bush. A story many don't know about Is how on 9/11 – it was Secretary Mineta who ordered planes flying to immediately land whether or not they had reached their destinations. As a result of

that fateful day, he also oversaw the creation of the Transportation Security Administration. Interestingly enough, during one of the speeches on Wednesday, a TSA announcement could be heard in the airport. Norm Mineta was a friend to everyone. The outcomes of these youth who do not reach their full potential are: joining gangs, failing grades, unhealthy eating, or suicide. PARTI provides a wide range of activities that connect youth in various communities to caring adults. Activities include leadership programs for youth, internship and mentor opportunities for college students and professional events for philanthropic adult engagement. Rebates up to \$3500 for Income-Qualified Customers Purchasing a Pre-Owned Electric Vehicle

Are you thinking about upgrading to a **pre-owned** all-electric vehicle (EV) or plugin hybrid electric vehicle? Silicon Valley Power offers incentives to income-qualified customers for the purchase of a pre-owned EV or plug-in hybrid vehicle. Receive \$1,500 for a fully electric vehicle or \$1,000 for a plug-in hybrid vehicle. Customers who meet LIHEAP income eligibility requirements may be eligible for a bonus rebate of \$1,000. To promote energy efficiency, vehicles with a miles per gallon of gasoline equivalent (MPGe) of 117 or greater may be eligible for a bonus rebate of \$1,000. This rebate **can be combined** with other programs, such as Federal tax credits, but all incentives may not exceed the vehicle purchase price. Extra Cardboard Curbside Collection Reminder

Cardboard should be broken down and folded before being placed inside the blue recycle cart with

the lid closed. Extra cardboard that cannot fit inside the blue cart should be flattened & bundled with twine, string, or packaging tape into 4' by 4' sections. Place the bundled cardboard next to the recycling cart for collection on your service day. Battery Disposal

Household batteries contain toxic materials and should never be placed in curbside collection carts or bins. If not properly disposed of, old batteries can pose a threat to the environment. Drop off your used household batteries for recycling at any of the following City facilities during open business hours: City Hall Municipal Service Counter, Senior Center, all Santa Clara libraries, and the Community Recreation Center. Batteries accepted include alkaline button cell, AA, AAA, C, D, 9V and lithium-ion. For safety purposes tape the ends of the battery terminals before placing into the battery recycling receptables. For decades, the Santa Clara Fire Department has been providing citizen emergency preparedness training through the Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) program. Throughout its history, our local program has trained over 1,000 Santa Clara residents to assist their neighbors in the event of a disaster or other emergency. After pausing during the pandemic, classes were restarted last year, and two more academies are being offered in 2024. The Santa Clara CERT Training Program consists of 21 hours of classroom and hands-on training taught by professional firefighters with extensive experience in emergency response. 


