CHILD ABUSE INVESTIGATIONS — CONFIDENTIAL RPs

The month of April is recognized as Child Abuse Prevention Month. As a reminder, pursuant to the 2023 Santa Clara County Child Abuse Protocol, the reporting party of an allegation of child abuse shall remain confidential.



II. CONFIDENTIALITY OF REPORT AND REPORTER

- A. The identity of all persons who report shall be confidential and disclosed only between employees of child protective agencies, or to the following individuals pursuant to Penal Code § 11167(d):
 - 1. Counsel representing child protective agencies.
 - 2. The district attorney in a criminal prosecution or an action instituted under Section 602 of the Welfare and Institutions Code.
 - 3. Counsel appointed to represent the minor in an action instituted under Section 300 of the Welfare and Institutions Code.
 - 4. Licensing agencies.
 - 5. Anyone identified by court order.

Officers: Please apply the "NON-DISCLOSURE" tab in MARK43 for the RP. Please mention in the body of your report, the RP shall remain confidential and be referred to as, "R/P, Mandated Reporter, etc...(whatever you chose)"
