

Fire Department Transports Patients

In March 2023, the Santa Clara Fire Department (SCFD) placed in operation an Advanced Life Support (ALS) ambulance staffed by firefighters to provide hospital transport services if

necessary. 1,257 patient transports were completed to nearby hospitals throughout the year. The SCFD is extremely pleased to provide this level of service to the citizens.



2023 Highlights

New Firefighters

The Santa Clara Fire Department (SCFD) graduated 20 new firefighters in 2023 in the largest fire academy throughout the history of the SCFD. The 20-week academy was concluded with a swearing in ceremony, and now these probationary firefighters are ready to begin their new assignments.



New Engine

The SCFD added a Spartan Metro Star Type I Engine to its emergency response fleet in December 2023. This new engine features some new gray color stripes and accents and will be stationed at Fire Station 1.



Sassafras

In September 2023, Driver/Engineer Phil Kleinheinz was paired with a two-year-old, black Lab named Sassy (short for Sassafras) by the National Disaster Search Dog Foundation. Sassy is a Search and Rescue K9 training with D/E Kleinheinz to pass certifications to deploy with California Task Force 3. Sassy is training to be able to find live victims under rubble piles and collapsed structures.

Response Times

Structure Fire Calls

Standard: The first unit will arrive in under 6 minutes from dispatch of alarm, 90% of the time.

Outcome: Santa Clara Fire Department arrived in 4 minutes and 44 seconds or less, 90% of the time.

Standard: Establish OSHA firefighter safety standard "2-in/2out" in less than 8 minutes from dispatch of alarm, 90% of the time.

Outcome: Santa Clara Fire Department met OSHA standard in 5 minutes and 42 seconds or less, 90% of the time.

Standard: Have an effective firefighting force (17 personnel) on-scene in less than 10 minutes from dispatch of alarm, 90% of the time.

Outcome: Santa Clara Fire Department's full effective response force arrived in 9 minutes and 14 seconds, 90% of the time.

Emergency Medical Calls

Standard: An Advanced Life Support fire company (includes firefighter/paramedic) will arrive in under 8 minutes from dispatch of alarm, 90% of the time.

Outcome: Santa Clara Fire Department arrived in 5 minutes and 55 seconds or less, 90% of the time.
