- Santa Clara Station Area Plan
 - In progress
 - Consultant contract signed in December 2023
 - 1st SATF meeting held on May 16, 2024; next meeting July 25, 2023





Development Projects



451 El Camino Real

- Demolition of 216,000 square feet of existing commercial buildings along with parking garages.
- Construction of a residential neighborhood with market-rate and affordable units, new utilities, and new trees, including:
 - 5-story residential building with 298 units
 - 98 townhouses, 3-stories tall

Code Violations Procedure


Procedure for Possible Code Violations

Step 1: A City staff member will ascertain if a code violation exists.

Step 2: City Staff will request remediation of the code violation, by:

- leaving a door tag with the violation identified, or
- an in person verbal request, or
- a mailed letter with the violation identified.

Step 3: If the violation has not been remediated within the given timeline, a Citation and fine will be issued.



 - 6 citations were issued









- Fall 2024 begins year 3 of the Two year residency requirement





- Troublesome behavior from SCU students.
 - Couch fire (post-Gonzaga game)
 - Thefts (Safeway, 10851, etc.)
 - Beer cans thrown at Officers
 - Disrespect (fleeing from Police, laughing about criminal behavior, etc.)

- Plain-clothes saturation patrols (via ABC Grant)
- 12 Officer deployment for SCU v Gonzaga basketball game
- Minor decoy/shoulder tap operations in area

Strict Enforcement Model

PD takes a tough stance on noise complaints

• CRT Officers are using a progressive enforcement model. Various first offenses can potentially result in warnings (educational element), but citations are also being issued on first offenses when noise is late or excessive.

Strict Enforcement Model

Property Owners Collaboration

- Regular follow-up meetings conducted to foster a good working relationship/information flow with property owners/managers.
- Property owners taking action in collaboration with CRT. "House meetings" are a good example of this (roughly **20** such meetings already this school year), as is the path to enforcement action (citations) and "blue tags"...



Blue Tags

- When a property has been identified as a "Nuisance" it can be blue tagged
- Each subsequent police or fire response is \$1000 minimum
- Blue tag must remain posted on residence for 90 days

IMPORTANT NOTICE REGARDING PUBLIC NUISANCE

PURSUANT TO SANTA CLARA CITY CODE CHAPTER 9.05, THE NEXT DISTURBANCE AT THE PREMISES WILL RESULT IN MONETARY PENALTIES IMPOSED UPON ALL PARTICIPANTS AND SPONSORS OF THE EVENT, AND ALL PROPERTY OWNERS OF THE PREMISES.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN THAT on 2-XX-2022, at 2:00 PM, the Santa Clara Police Department found that a public nuisance caused by a disturbance of the public peace and/or threat to public safety occurred at the premises located at 1234 Main Street in Santa Clara, CA.

If there is a subsequent event on these premises that constitutes such a public nuisance and necessitates the intervention of the Police Department or Fire Department on or before 2-XX-2023, every participant in and sponsor of such event shall be jointly and severally liable for the monetary penalties connected with this response (any subsequent event at the same premises, which necessitates City intervention, shall result in a fee of one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00)). If there is a subsequent event on these premises that constitutes such a public nuisance and necessitates the intervention of the Police Department or Fire Department within one (1) year from the date of this notice, the occupants and owner of the premises shall be jointly and severally liable for the costs connected with any subsequent response.



Blue Tags

- Blue-tags used more frequently as a tool to combat nuisances.
- NOTE: SCPD has adjusted the blue tag approach to carry over from the previous year.
- Currently **3** blue tags are active, with multiple other houses on the verge of being blue-tagged (meetings conducted with all)



Citation Statistics

As of 5/18/23:

- \$38,400 in fines
- *\$556.52 per citation*

<u>As of 5/15/24:</u>

- \$49,500 in fines
- *\$668.91 per citation*

The goal is not to produce money, but to change behavior and bring peace to the neighborhood



Working with Students

- Conversations with students to educate on driving factors for behavior and police response
- Actions taken by SCPD to promote health and safety of students
 - Prowlers / stalkers
 - Fentanyl dangers
 - Proactively addressing "bad actors" (internal and external)
- Building relationships with student organizations
- Police participation in SCU activities to build rapport and trust
- Firm, but fair approach



Graduation Planning

- Continued ABC grant-funded operations in the area.
- Increased staffing of Team 200.
- Staffing of officers at commencement ceremonies.
- Coordination with SCU Campus Safety and SCFD.

Background

- **Established in 1990** to review student housing issues (formerly Student Housing Committee).
- **June 2006**, Council combined the Santa Clara University/City Liaison Committee and the NURC due to their similar topics and established a meeting process. The NURC was a standing committee, meeting once a year, with a Task Force to address issues relating to the NURC, meeting two to four times a year and reporting to the NURC.
- The new NURC established a forum for on-going communication and problem solving among City officials, neighborhoods, property owners and Santa Clara University officials and students.
- **June 23, 2009**, NURC established a schedule of 3 meetings per year (October /November, February and April/May) to allow for more time for dialogue.



Team 300

- Established in 2016
- An "Internal Team" to deal with enforcement issues in the University area that meets monthly to coordinate, exchange information, and problem solve issues that arise.
- This team is comprised of staff from:
 - Planning Code Enforcement
 - Public Works Streets Division (trash/recycling)
 - Police Department
 - SCU Security
 - SCU Off-Campus Student Life staff
 - Property Managers
 - Old Quad Residents Association Representative



Discussion
